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# i. Accountability Questions on your Stewardship of Time and Resources

- i. Is there anything that stood out to you from this chapter? Any questions, observations, or encouragements?
- ii. From pages 100-101, why is remembering God's past help essential for cultivating faith in His future grace?

Answer: "The reason God wants them to look back on "the former things" is to increase their confidence in the future things he is planning for them... Remembering the former things that God has done gives a good foundation for believing his Word when he says, 'I will accomplish all my purpose.'"

iii. From pages 102-103, according to Piper, what does Paul mean when he says: "For all the promises of God find their Yes in him."?

Answer: Christ is God's final, unified *Yes* to every promise. In Him, God's heart toward believers is undivided—every blessing, gift, and promise is signed over to their account. Jesus is the foundation of all future grace.

- iv. From pages 104-107. How does the meaning of "Amen" tie past grace, future grace, and prayer together?
  - Answer: Amen means "Yes, Lord." When we pray "in Jesus' name, Amen," we echo God's Yes to us in Christ. Prayer becomes our Yes to His Yes, expressing faith that every future grace He has promised will be fulfilled for His glory.
- v. When you face fear or discouragement, do you intentionally recall God's past mercies in your life? Why or why not?
- vi. What specific memories of God's faithfulness could you return to more often as a source of renewed trust?
- vii. How might you cultivate the discipline of remembering grace—not just casually, but prayerfully and regularly?
- viii. In your group's prayer time, ask the Lord to help you "remember Him on your bed" and "meditate in the watches of the night" (Psalm 63:6). Pray for a heart that recalls His help in the past and sings for joy in the shadow of His wings, confident that He will be faithful again.
