i. Accountability Questions on your Marriage, Singleness & Family Life

- ☐ Married: Did you love and honor your spouse as Christ commands? Single: How are you using your singleness to serve the Lord without distraction?
- ☐ Married/Parents: Did you pray with and disciple your children in God's Word? Single: Are you pursuing fellowship so you are not walking alone?
- ☐ Married or Single: Have you modeled repentance, forgiveness, and godliness in your household or community?
- ☐ Married or Single: Are you guarding against discontentment and trusting God's timing? (Discontentment is dissatisfaction with one's circumstance which often comes when we compare our circumstances with others around us).

- 4. Lesson Time. (40-55 minutes) __:35 __:35 __:30
 - i. Is there anything that stood out to you from this chapter? Any questions, observations, or encouragements?
 - ii. From pages 109-110, What makes Romans 8:32 "the solid logic of heaven"? Answer: The verse not only promises future grace but builds it on an unbreakable foundation—God's own act of not sparing His Son. The promise's certainty is as strong as God's love for His Son; it is logically impossible for it to fail.
 - iii. From pages 113-114, How does Piper address the question, "Does God really give us all things?" when our experience includes suffering and loss?

 Answer: He explains that God gives believers "all things" that serve their ultimate good (Rom. 8:31–37). No opposition can succeed against God's elect because every event—tribulation, distress, even death—becomes a servant of their eternal joy.

- iv. From page 114. What assurance does this promise give believers facing pain or setbacks?

 Answer: God strips every trial of its destructive power, transforming it into a means of sanctification and joy. Every setback, controversy, or pain is sovereignly repurposed to enlarge the believer's delight in God.
- v. In what areas do you struggle to believe that God will provide for you?
- vi. How does the truth that God "did not spare His own Son" confront your doubts about His ongoing care?
- vii. How can you more deliberately apply the logic of Romans 8:32 to your worries, plans, and hopes?
- viii. In your group's prayer time, praise God for the cross, the ultimate guarantee of His future grace. Ask Him to help you reason with faith—arguing from the greater to the lesser: "If He gave His Son, will He not also...?"

 - i. Ask for specific prayer requests from members.
 - ii. Pray for one another as you wish.
 - iii. Write down these prayer requests so you can follow up in the next meeting.
