- i. Is there anything that stood out to you from this chapter? Any questions, observations, or encouragements?
- ii. From pages 119-120, Piper unpacks four "pillars" that uphold the promise of Romans 8:28.What are they, and why are they unshakeable?Answer: The second paragraph on top of page 120.
- iii. From pages 121-122, Why does Piper insist that the "call" in Romans 8:30 must be an effective, faith-creating call??

Answer: Because Paul says *all* the called are justified, and justification is only by faith. Therefore, the call must create the faith it commands—like Jesus calling Lazarus from the grave—ensuring that all the called will indeed believe and be justified (page 121).

iv. From pages 123-125, What is the deepest foundation beneath predestination, and why does Piper say it is essential?

Answer: The deepest foundation is God's **foreknowledge**—not foresight of human faith, but God's eternal, gracious choice to set His saving love on particular people. This sovereign,

electing love guarantees predestination, calling, justification, and glorification—and therefore guarantees Romans 8:28.

- v. Do you ever doubt that "all things" are really being worked for your good? Why?
- vi. Which of the four pillars (sovereignty, wisdom, goodness, faithfulness) is hardest for you to believe in practice?
- vii. How might meditating on these attributes of God change the way you respond to suffering or uncertainty?
- viii. In your group's prayer time, pray that God would anchor your faith in who He is, not what you see. Ask Him to remind you that He is working for your good—even in the dark—and to deepen your rest in His wise, loving rule.
