## Post Grad Group Agenda

### Lesson 24 – Week of March 30<sup>th</sup>

1. Mingling and catching up. (10 minutes)
2. Begin with a short prayer for your time together. (5 minutes)
3. Move to a time of accountability. (20 minutes) 
  - i. **Accountability Questions on your Stewardship of Time & Resources**
    - Married: Did you love and honor your spouse as Christ commands?  
Single: How are you using your singleness to serve the Lord without distraction?
    - Married/Parents: Did you pray with and disciple your children in God's Word?  
Single: Are you pursuing fellowship so you are not walking alone?
    - Have you modeled repentance, forgiveness, and godliness in your household or community?
    - Married or Single: Are you guarding against discontentment and trusting God's timing?  
(Discontentment is dissatisfaction with one's circumstance which often comes when we compare our circumstances with others around us).
  - ii. **Homework**
    - Did you accomplish at least five devotionals this week?
    - Did you read *Future Grace*, Chapter 23?
4. Lesson Time. (40-55 minutes)  
  - i. Is there anything that stood out to you from this chapter? Any questions, observations, or encouragements?
  - ii. From page 287. How does Piper define "ministry," and why is it central to every Christian's life?  
**Answer: Ministry is not a formal office but a lifestyle of doing good and advancing others' faith and holiness. All Christians are called to ministry, not just pastors, who equip others for it. Ministry is essentially making much of Christ in every sphere of life.**
  - iii. From pages 290-291. How does Paul describe the relationship between his effort and God's grace in ministry?  
**Answer: Paul says, "I worked...though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me" (1 Corinthians 15:10). This means that while Paul actively labored, grace was the decisive cause of his work—empowering him moment by moment.**

- iv. From pages 293-294. How do spiritual gifts function as channels of future grace?  
**Answer: Spiritual gifts are means by which believers receive and distribute God's grace to others (1 Peter 4:10-11). When we serve, we do so "by the strength that God supplies," meaning ministry is the channel through which future grace flows to meet others' needs.**
- v. Do you value ease or personal security more than the call to serve and speak for Christ? Explain.
- vi. In what ways are you tempted to shrink back from sacrificial ministry due to fear?
- vii. What promises from God could sustain you to keep going even when ministry is costly?
- viii. In your group's prayer time, pray that your heart would echo Paul's: "I do not account my life of any value... if only I may finish my course" (Acts 20:24). Ask for strength to endure trials and joy to count it all gain for Christ.
