

Join us in person for Lessons and Carols on December 21

The Festival Service of Nine Lessons and Carols will take place on Sunday evening, December 21, at 7 p.m. in the church. The choir and organ will be in splendid voice, and the beautiful carols and anthems will be the perfect introduction to the last days before Christmas.

The Festival Service of Nine Lessons and Carols, which began in England in the early 1900s, is now a part of Anglican and Episcopal worship throughout the world. The service is made up of lessons alternating with the singing of congregational and choral music. Beginning with the story of Adam and Eve, the lessons trace the prophecies of the Nativity and end with the beautiful passage from John: "In the Beginning was the Word...."

I invite all of you to join the choir on the 21st, and in the words of the beautiful opening prayer,

to hear again the message of the angels, and in heart and mind to go even unto Bethlehem and see this thing which is come to pass...

Preparing the way: Our search for a new Rector

The Holy Spirit Rector search committee has been working on our Parish Profile, which describes who we are as a spiritual community, why Holy Spirit would be a fabulous place for a new Rector to want to work, and what a wonderful place Missoula is to live. This will become our advertisement for the Rector position at Holy Spirit. We have finished a draft Profile and are working on the graphic design with Kirk Johnson.

In addition to the Profile, the search committee is beginning work on the national Episcopal Church's Office for Transition Ministry's (OTM's) Portfolio. The OTM Profile is a set of answers to specific questions about the position that Rectors searching for new positions can access.

You, our congregation have a role in this search! Stay tuned for our letter and digital copies of the Parish Profile so that you can contact Rectors and parishes you know that may be interested in our role at Holy Spirit. It is entirely possible that the Rector we seek is someone who doesn't know they want to come to Holy Spirit yet.

No matter which service you attend—or if you come to all three—know that you are part of a community gathered in love, hope, and joy. Let's celebrate together.



When does Baptism take place at Holy Spirit?

Holy Baptism is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's Body the Church. Baptism takes place during the Easter Vigil service (Saturday evening, in April), and at a Sunday service about three times a year: the Day of Pentecost (at the end of May next year), the Sunday after All Saints' Day (early November), and the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord (the first Sunday after Epiphany, in early January). Baptism may also take place when the bishop visits (in December this year), and on a Sunday during the summer on a date to be determined. If you are interested in Baptism for yourself or for your child, preparation needs to take place. Please contact the office at (406) 542-2167 to speak with one of our co-rectors.

The next date for Baptism will be on January 11, 2026, the Baptism of Our Lord.

Community Ministries The Hope in being SEEN

Parenting Place (PP) and the Child Abuse Prevention Network of Montana recently hosted a screening and discussion of SEEN: THE FILM. SEEN is described as an intimate exploration of how personal healing can profoundly impact the journey of parenthood. PP Executive Director, Ivy Anderson, noted how each parent in the film spoke of how they were repeating the parenting styles they experienced without realizing the harm they were perpetuating. The film lifted up the importance of a parent's mental health and the work of healing their own childhood wounds as they work to parent in new ways. As in so much of the work of PP, opportunities like gathering for SEEN spread awareness and uplift hope that it's never too late to repair relationships.

At its core, PP is about meeting parents and caregivers of children where they are at, truly seeing them, and nurturing trauma-informed practices that can reveal and heal. Socks, gloves, and hats needed for houseless men and women

For the tenth straight year, Holy Spirit will be conducting its annual sock-hat-scarf-glove-mitten drive to collect warm apparel for our houseless brothers and sisters who are receiving shelter at the Poverello Center or are sleeping outside and being served by the Housing Outreach Team (The HOT Team). This season's drive will begin on Sunday, January 4, and will continue through Sunday, January 18. Ye olde red-and-white striped box will once again be set up in the parish hall to collect your wooly socks, hats, scarves, gloves and mittens. Donations also can be placed in a plastic bin located on the porch outside the church office.

The needs of the houseless are especially great this year, due to funding cuts, the closure of the Johnson Street shelter, and a winter predicted to be colder and snowier in the northern United States.

As always, we welcome items that are hand-knit, store-bought or gently used. Please remember: socks should be made from wool or synthetic fabrics such as Thermolite. Please NO COTTON! Cotton does not keep out the cold and fails to wick away moisture, making feet feel damp and cold. Houseless men and women who sleep at the Poverello Center spend many of their daytime hours outside in our cold, snowy, and windy winter weather. The Pov's HOT Team also serves those individuals who are shelter resistant and sleep outdoors or in their vehicles. As a result, the Pov goes through countless pairs of socks and other wooly items in a single day!

We appreciate whatever items you can donate to this critically important drive. If parishioners would like to place a bin outside their homes or work spaces and accept donations from their neighbors, coworkers, or customers, please email me at lucia.solowork@gmail.com. I am happy to provide the bin and signage and collect the contents as needed.

As you are doing your holiday shopping this year, please remember to pick up some warm socks, hats, scarves, gloves or mittens for our houseless neighbors. Thanks in advance for your generosity!


