Answering the call: POV Overflow at Holy Spirit

You have likely heard that Holy Spirit has been invited to participate in the POV overflow program. Rev. John Daniels from First United Methodist Church reached out this fall, inviting Holy Spirit to consider this opportunity to serve our community. After consultation and brainstorming with the staff and Vestry we have chosen to move forward with this program. A subgroup of the Vestry has been hard at work planning for these potential guests. We have two weeks that we will be "on call", February 1-7 and February 22-28. Any night during those two weeks when the Poverello Center has reached its capacity and the weather is 10 degrees or colder, we will host guests from the POV (up to 20 people), and they will sleep in the parish hall. They will be vetted by POV staff and supervised overnight

by staff from the Missoula Interfaith Collaborative.

Twenty-one volunteers from Holy Spirit have signed up to help with this initiative! Two volunteers will welcome guests in the evening at 8 pm and make sure the building is secure. Two volunteers will arrive at 7 am to make coffee and serve some light breakfast treats. Rev. Gretchen and Rev. Terri will rotate being one of those morning volunteers. Guests will leave by 8 am, and the volunteers will do a walk-through making sure everything is in order for the day.

We feel good about the work that has been done to prepare for these guests and for the loving support of the congregation to help provide for members of our community. It will be challenging, no doubt, but we believe it is the right thing to do.

Our Lenten journey begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a season of reflection, renewal, and preparation for Easter. The day takes its name from the ancient practice of placing ashes on the foreheads of worshippers — ashes traditionally made from the palm branches of the previous year. As the Ash Wednesday liturgy reminds us:

Grant that these ashes may be to us a sign of our mortality and penitence, that we may

remember that it is only by your gracious gift that we are given everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.

This year, we will gather for **Holy Eucharist with the Imposition of Ashes at both 12 noon and 7 p.m.** We invite you to join us at either service as we begin our Lenten journey together, turning our hearts toward the hope and promise of Easter.

ERD Sunday – a day to remember those in need

Christian Fasting: A misunderstood gift



Rector Search Update

Continuing the Journey Toward Our New Rector

The Search Committee continues to accept applications from candidates for our new rector. Given the huge competition for rector candidates, we are reviewing the applications as they are submitted.

After a tabulated screening review of the application, the Search Committee decides whether to offer the candidate a Zoom interview. If the Search Committee wants additional information, we may schedule a second Zoom interview. Should the applicant sufficiently impress the committee, the candidate may be asked to come to Missoula for an in-person interview, including an opportunity to preach. The Vestry and the congregation will all get a chance

to meet the candidate during their Missoula visit. The Search Committee will then decide whether to recommend the candidate to the Vestry, which makes the final hiring decision.

Holy Spirit Parish is partnering once again with the Montana Red Cross to host our annual **Winter Blood Drive** on **Thursday, February 12**, from **1:00–6:00 p.m.** in the Parish Hall.

Winter is one of the hardest times of year for the Red Cross to collect enough blood. Storms, illness, and seasonal travel all reduce donations — even as the need stays constant. **Every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood**, whether they’re recovering from an accident, undergoing surgery, or receiving treatment for cancer. Community Ministries Moving in Gratitude and Reciprocity during Lent 2026

The Episcopal Church is inviting our focus on Gratitude and Reciprocity during this Lenten season, leaning into Robin Wall Kimmerer's book "The Serviceberry: Abundance and Reciprocity in the Natural World."

The serviceberry is common to the traditional food of Robin's Potawatomi tribe, and in its abundance, she sees a metaphor for giving for all living beings. The Church writes that in the Native way, there is no me, but we: Sustenance is not just for the individual, but for the community. Robin asserts that we can only flourish when that flourishing is mutual. She notes, "If our first response to the receipt of gifts is gratitude, then our second is reciprocity: to give a gift in return" in thankfulness rather than obligation, to

fuel a healing and thriving cycle of mutual blessing. "Gratitude and reciprocity are the currency of a gift economy, and they have the remarkable property of multiplying with every exchange, their energy concentrating as they pass from hand to hand, a truly renewable resource."

In our ministries of "we" with The Parenting Place, Hellgate High School, Missoula Interfaith Collaborative, and beyond, let's see what abundance is nurtured by moving in gratitude and reciprocity.
