For 2025, annual gifts totaled a strong \$410,000. Thank you!


A surplus from this year, when we've had less clergy compensation to provide, offers us a bit of buffer for the larger compensation needs ahead. This fall, we're aiming for \$420,000, which will supply the budget needs of 2026. Somewhat more stretch comes in our 2027 budget, when we'll look to reach \$435,000 in annual gifts.




Stewardship Sunday is November 2.
