- 1 → What voices in your life—cultural, personal, or spiritual—have tried to define your worth? How does the confession “I belong to Jesus” speak against or reframe those voices?
- 2 → Why do you think we, even in the church, so easily turn belonging into a performance-based identity?
- 3 → How does baptism challenge the idea that belonging must be earned? What’s radical about the timing of Jesus’ own baptism?
- 4 → Galatians 2:20 speaks of being “crucified with Christ” and now living “by faith.” How do you interpret that tension between death and life in your own walk with Jesus?
- 5 → Can you name a time when you felt claimed by God, a person, or a community? What did that moment do to your sense of identity?
- 6 → Have you ever wrestled with the idea that your baptism didn’t “stick” or that you weren’t “ready”? Where do you think that doubt comes from, and how do you imagine God sees it?
- 7 → **EXTRA CREDIT:** If baptism is both a funeral and a birth, what part of your life do you need to bury, and what new thing might God be trying to raise up in you?
