Jesus's Invitation to the Rich Ruler (Luke 18:18-30) The Transfiguration (Luke 9:28-36)

- ①→ Jesus tells the man to "follow me"—a phrase used for discipleship. How does radical surrender relate to true discipleship?
- ②→ God speaks from the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to Him." How does this command to "listen" connect to the challenge Jesus gives the rich ruler?
- 3→ The Transfiguration reveals Jesus's true glory, while the story of the rich ruler reveals a man unwilling to leave his treasures. How do these two passages contrast different visions of "glory"?
- ④→ If we could truly see Jesus in His glory, like at the Transfiguration, would it change what we value and cling to? Why do we still struggle to let go, even with faith?
- S→ Jesus is revealed in glory on the mountain but later heads toward suffering in Jerusalem. How does this contrast between glory and sacrifice shape our understanding of what it means to follow Him?
- **6** → How does Jesus redefine what is truly "valuable" in both of these stories? How should His definition of treasure change the way we live?
- **7→ EXTRA CREDIT:** What do you think "treasure in heaven" actually looks like? How does it compare to earthly treasure?
