- 3 → Name one recent decision you called wise. Would you have made it if no one would ever know? Why?
- 4 → When did you last say "I don't know" about something you actually knew, because the truth was too costly? What was the cost?
- 5 → Fear costs truth first, then courage, then integrity. Which one's thinnest in you right now — and who besides you could actually tell?
- 6 → Whose opinion has more say over your decisions than you've ever said out loud? Why? Is this good?
- 7 → Where is the will there in you, but the nerve isn't?
- 8 → **EXTRA CREDIT:** What are you still holding back until it feels safe? What would it take to say it this week?
