The Immigration Committee is looking for 3-4 men who would be willing to serve on an Accompaniment Team with an asylum seeker through Jonathan House.

Accompaniment Teams commit to walking alongside a Jonathan House resident as companions, advocates, and friends by offering consistent, caring presence through regular visits and outings.

Team members provide practical support with everyday needs like transportation, clothing, food, healthcare, etc.

Training and support is provided through monthly meetings with Jonathan House Staff.

This is a one year commitment.
