### CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL UPDATE

#### **Congregational Council Update:**

The new 2025-2026 council has started to meet and we are getting to know our new roles. As a way to get to know each other on a deeper level we will begin each council meeting with a devotional developed by Pastor Kent. Each month, one member will be sharing their personal faith journey and consider how our gifts and talents fit to help further the mission of RLC. Sarah Richter has also agreed to take on the new role as liaison to the Properties Project team.

#### Finance Committee Update (As of 9/30/25)

#### Fiscal Year June 2025 - July 2026

The first quarter 2025 offering - \$236,166. Down \$52,023 from first quarter 2024. 2024 number includes \$45,000 special appeal to help cover insurance rate hike. Total receipts (includes offering and other income) are over budget by \$14,022.31. Expenses are under budget as of 9/30/2025 by \$32,795. This is mostly due to staffing reductions, but will be less after positions are filled. Please refer to full reports in the publications section of the RLC website.

#### **RLC Preschool/Childcare Task Force Update**

The RLC Preschool/Childcare Task Force consists of Julie Hanson, Lori Haaland, Val Velde, Heidi Gaedy, Gena Mickley, and Lorene Roste with KJ Bach as advisor. Since RLC will no longer be involved in extensive preschool and childcare, except for Sunday mornings, the Task Force has been assigned the responsibility of removing all of the supplies, toys, books, puzzles, games, furniture, etc., from all of the preschool and child care rooms on the upper and lower levels of the preschool and child care wing of the church. Some items may be repurposed for the nursery and/or the parents' room in the church commons.

Currently the Task Force is assembling all of the items in 2 to 3 main areas for the purpose of taking inventory, sorting and organizing, and then devising a plan for how to sell, donate, and/or provide supplies RLC doesn't need to other local child care organizations. On Wednesday evening, October 8, several confirmation students helped the task force move all of the preschool/ child care toys, games, puzzles, etc., to one room so they can be sorted, organized, and disposed of to benefit the community. The students moved several roomfuls of items in half an hour. The task force is very thankful for their assistance.


#### November 23rd & 30th
