The Roseville Lutheran Church (RLC) Endowment Fund provides funding through grant requests for projects that fit within one of the following ministry areas of RLC:

- Faith, Worship and Prayer
- Discipleship
- Service and Stewardship
- Evangelism

Examples of projects that might fit within these ministry areas include:

- Seed money for new missions
- Educational programs
- Sponsorship and scholarships for youth camps and retreats
- Funding for church capital projects not normally funded by the RLC Budget
- Local, regional, and world mission projects
- Support for natural disaster relief
- Worship and music

The grant application form can be found at the QR code below. Grant applications are reviewed twice annually and applications need to be received by May 1 or October 1 in

order to be considered at the ensuing committee meeting. To apply for a grant, completed and submit an online application form by October 1.



Ongoing financial support for the Endowment Fund comes from donations

and fundraisers like the Love Lights Campaign that occurs during Advent. The Fund accepts gifts of money, securities, and properties, both real and personal. Gifts to the Fund are exempt from federal and state inheritance taxes and capital gains taxes. Gifts given individually qualify as deductible for tax purposes.

# INSURANCE UPDATE

# Update from the Executive Committee About Insurance:

We felt it would be helpful to give you an update on RLC's insurance situation. Recall that in 2024, our previous insurer, Church Mutual, notified RLC of non-renewal due to trends in the insurance industry and RLC's claim history. This bumped us to the secondary market, leading to a quintupling of our annual premium for property and liability from about \$30,000 to about \$150,000 (March 2024 to March 2025). On renewal of these policies in March 2025, the annual premium reduced considerably to about \$81,000. Since March, we have worked with HUB International and, as of August 1st, have locked in good coverage for an annual premium of \$57,000 (with a prorated refund of our premium paid in March). Working with HUB, we hope to get back on the standard market as soon as November to further reduce the cost of these important coverages. Thank you to our Interim Finance Director, Carol Garbisch and the Finance Committee (Nick Velde, Merle Gaedy, Rebecca Field, and Jim Stark) for diligently working on this important issue over the last 18 months.

## Children, Youth, and Family Ministry at RLC

We are excited to partner with Nick Clark, from InterServe Ministries, who will be working with us for Sunday RLC Kids and our Wednesday Confirmation ministry. We are also in the process of hiring a CYF Intern from RLC to help us keep our CYF ministries strong and growing throughout the coming year!

Nick Clark has been serving in congregational youth ministry since 2009 and has been with InterServe Ministries for three years. #### Sept. 14 & 21:


