New Testament Reading

Hebrews 10:26-36

For if we go on sinning deliberately after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, but a fearful expectation of judgment, and a fury of fire that will consume the adversaries. Anyone who has set aside the law of Moses dies without mercy on the evidence of two or three witnesses. How much worse punishment, do you think, will be deserved by the one who has trampled underfoot the Son of God, and has profaned the blood of the covenant by which he was sanctified, and has outraged the Spirit of grace? For we know him who said, "Vengeance is mine; I will repay." And again, "The Lord will judge his people." It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God. But recall the former days when, after you were enlightened, you endured a hard struggle with sufferings, sometimes being publicly exposed to reproach and affliction, and sometimes being partners with those so treated. For you had compassion on those in prison, and you joyfully accepted the plundering of your property, since you knew that you yourselves had a better possession and an abiding one. Therefore do not throw away your confidence, which has a great reward. For you have need of endurance, so that when you have done the will of God you may receive what is promised.

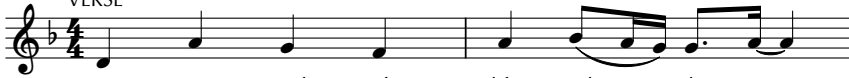
OFFERING

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SCRIPTURE Reading

Deuteronomy 32:1-43, (NIV)

¹Listen, you heavens, and I will speak; hear, you earth, the words of my mouth. ²Let my teaching fall like rain and my words descend like dew, like showers on new grass, like abundant rain on tender plants. ³I will proclaim the name of the Lord. Oh, praise the greatness of our God! ⁴He is the Rock, his works are perfect, and all his ways are just. A faithful God who does no wrong, upright and just is he. ⁵They are corrupt and not his children; to their shame they are a warped and crooked generation. ⁶Is this the way you repay the Lord, you foolish and unwise people? Is he not your Father, your Creator, who made you and formed you? ⁷Remember the days of old; consider the generations long past. Ask your father and he will tell you, your elders, and they will explain to you. ⁸When the Most High gave the nations their inheritance, when he divided all mankind, he set up boundaries for the peoples according to the number of the sons of Israel. ⁹For the Lord's portion is his people, Jacob his allotted inheritance. ¹⁰In a desert land he found him, in a barren and howling waste. He shielded him and cared for him; he guarded him as the apple of his eye, ¹¹like an eagle that stirs up its nest and hovers over its young, that spreads its wings to catch them and carries them aloft. ¹²The Lord alone led him; no foreign god was with him. ¹³He made him ride on the heights of the land and fed him with the fruit of the fields. He nourished him with honey from the rock, and with oil from the flinty crag, ¹⁴with curds and milk from herd and flock and with fattened lambs and goats, with choice rams of Bashan and the finest kernels of wheat. You drank the foaming blood of the grape. ¹⁵Jeshurun grew fat and kicked; filled with food, they became heavy and sleek. They abandoned the God who made them and rejected the Rock their Savior. ¹⁶They made him jealous with their foreign gods and angered him with their detestable idols. ¹⁷They sacrificed to false gods, which are not God—gods they had not known, gods that recently appeared, gods your ancestors did not fear. ¹⁸You deserted the Rock, who fathered you; you forgot the God who gave you birth. ¹⁹The Lord saw this and rejected them because he was angered by his sons and daughters. ²⁰"I will hide my face from them," he said, "and see what their end will be; for they are a perverse generation, children who are unfaithful. ²¹They made me jealous by what is no god and angered me with their worthless idols. I will make them envious by those who are not a people; I will make them angry by a nation that has no understanding. ²²For a fire will be kindled by my wrath, one that burns down to the realm of the dead below. It will devour the earth and its harvests and set afire the foundations of the mountains. ²³"I will heap calamities on them and spend my arrows against them. ²⁴I will send wasting famine against them, consuming pestilence and deadly plague; I will send against them the fangs of wild beasts, the venom of vipers that glide in the dust. ²⁵In the street the sword will make them childless; in their homes terror will reign. The young men and young women will perish, the infants and those with gray hair. ²⁶I said I would scatter them and erase their name from human memory, ²⁷but I dreaded the taunt of the enemy, lest the adversary misunderstand and say, 'Our hand has triumphed; the Lord has not done all this.'" ²⁸They are a nation without sense, there is no discernment in them. ²⁹If only they were wise and would understand this and discern what their end will be! ³⁰How could one man chase a thousand, or two put ten thousand to flight, unless their Rock had sold them, unless the Lord had given them up? ³¹For their rock is not like our Rock, as even our enemies concede. ³²Their vine comes from the vine of Sodom and from the fields of Gomorrah. Their grapes are filled with poison, and their clusters with bitterness. ³³Their wine is the venom of serpents, the deadly poison of cobras. ³⁴"Have I not kept this in reserve and sealed it in my vaults? ³⁵It is mine to avenge; I will repay. In due time their foot will slip; their day of disaster is near and their doom rushes upon them." ³⁶The Lord will vindicate his people and relent concerning his servants when he sees their strength is gone and no one is left, slave or free. ³⁷He will say: "Now where are their gods, the rock they took refuge in, ³⁸the gods who ate the fat of their sacrifices and drank the wine of their drink offerings? Let them rise up to help you! Let them give you shelter! ³⁹"See now that I myself am he! There is no god besides me. I put to death and I bring to life, I have wounded and I will heal, and no one can deliver out of my hand. ⁴⁰I lift my hand to heaven and solemnly swear: As surely as I live forever, ⁴¹when I sharpen my flashing sword and my hand grasps it in judgment, I will take vengeance on my adversaries and repay those who hate me. ⁴²I will make my arrows drunk with blood, while my sword devours flesh: the blood of the slain and the captives, the heads of the enemy leaders." ⁴³Rejoice, you nations, with his people, for he will avenge the blood of his servants; he will take vengeance on his enemies and make atonement for his land and people.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION

Confession & Encouragement

Often we find that our hearts worship something other than God. In confessing our sins, the Holy Spirit probes our hearts and minds and graciously shows us what we mistakenly believe will give us life. Jesus is good to lead us from sorrow over our sin to the sweetness of His grace.
