



A Worship Discussion Guide for Individuals, Groups & Families for the week of November 19, 2023

Read the Bible passage aloud in your group meeting. This is a worship discussion guide, and our reflections and applications are grounded in Scripture. You do not need to work through the whole guide. Decide which points would be most helpful for your meeting, and use them as a starting point for your time together.

Warm Up

- **Name one thing you have in your care that you actually do not own. How does caretaking affect your use of that thing?**

I Corinthians 6:13-20

¹³“Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food”—and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. ¹⁴And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. ¹⁵Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! ¹⁶Or do you not know that he who is joined to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For, as it is written, “The two will become one flesh.” ¹⁷But he who is joined to the Lord becomes one spirit with him. ¹⁸Flee from sexual immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the sexually immoral person sins against his own body. ¹⁹Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, ²⁰for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body.

You Are Not Your Own

- **Who might Paul be quoting in verse 13? How does he respond to the quote?**
- **What does Paul teach about the body in vv.13-17? What reasons does he give for precluding sexual immorality?**
- **The Holy Spirit lives in God’s people (19), and Jesus Christ purchased us—We are not your own (20). Consider your body: Is there a way you are encouraged or challenged today that God lives in you, and you belong to Him?**
- **Reflect on this week’s passage together, and use it as a guide for a time of prayer.**
