

A Worship Discussion Guide for Individuals, Groups & Families for the week of February 25, 2024

Read the Bible passage aloud in your group meeting. This is a worship discussion guide, and our reflections and applications are grounded in Scripture. You do not need to work through the whole guide. Decide which points would be most helpful for your meeting, and use them as a starting point for your time together.

Warm Up

• When do you have trouble listening? What does it take to listen well?

I Corinthians 14:33b-40

^{33b} As in all the churches of the saints, ³⁴ the women should keep silent in the churches. For they are not permitted to speak, but should be in submission, as the Law also says. ³⁵ If there is anything they desire to learn, let them ask their husbands at home. For it is shameful for a woman to speak in church.

- In healthy families, communities—and congregations—there is an order to speaking and listening. What challenges to hearing and being heard does Paul address as he speaks to this church?
- For several chapters, Paul has called the Corinthians to honor God and one another whenever they gather. The Corinthian women were bringing shame dishonor on the congregation because of the way they conducted themselves in the church's gathering. What would be examples of how we might dishonor one another in worship?
- Paul's instruction is by the Lord's command (37) for universal application for "all the churches" (33). Women are clearly commanded "to be silent in the churches" (34), and the reason for woman's silence must be "in submission, as the Law says" (34). However, women are commanded to faithfully participate in the worship of God: praying, prophesying, and singing in the congregation (I Corinthians 11:5; Colossians 3:16). So, what is the command that is to be obeyed?

Orderly Worship

³⁶Or was it from you that the word of God came? Or are you the only ones it has reached? ³⁷ If anyone thinks that he is a prophet, or spiritual, he should acknowledge that the things I am writing to you are a command of the Lord. ³⁸ If anyone does not recognize this, he is not recognized. ³⁹ So, my brothers, earnestly desire to prophesy, and do not forbid speaking in tongues. ⁴⁰ But all things should be done decently and in order.

- Paul basically tells the Corinthians, "do you think everything revolves around you and what you have to say?" (36-37). How have you experienced your own self-focus getting in the way of worship?
- Prophets are obligated to do more than speak: They must submit to the Lord (38-39).
 A prophet who won't submit to the Lord isn't much of a prophet! Why is this true?
- Paul concludes that all the speaking, practice of spiritual gifts, and cooperation as the body of Christ "should be done decently and in order" (40). What spiritual qualities and practices should order the church whenever she gathers?
- Ultimately, Jesus is King and Head of His Church, and His Word is the Message. How is this a challenge or encouragement to you?
- Reflect on this week's passage together, and use it as a guide for a time of prayer.
