

A Worship Discussion Guide for Individuals, Groups & Families for the week of November 17, 2024

Read the Bible passage aloud in your group meeting. This is a worship discussion guide, and our reflections and applications are grounded in Scripture. You do not need to work through the whole guide. Decide which points would be most helpful for your meeting, and use them as a starting point for your time together.

Warm Up

• What will it be like to see God face to face one day? Why?

Jude 1:24-25 Only Savior; All Glory

²⁴ Now to him who is able to keep you from stumbling and to present you blameless before the presence of his glory with great joy, ²⁵ to the only God, our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion, and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen.

- What does Jude trust that God able to do? (24)
- What kind of person can stand in the presence of God, according to Jude?
- What does our sinless God have to do to present us blameless? Read Colossians 1:21-22 for more insight.
- In light of these verses, what do you think it will be like to be in God's presence one day? Why? Read <u>Isaiah 25:8-9</u> and <u>Revelation 19:6-8</u> to fill out the picture.
- When Jude writes, "to the only God, our Savior", what is he ascribing to God? (25)
- Jude closes his letter with hopeful praise to God. What is one of God's attributes or deeds that stirs you to praise Him these days? Why?

Each Sunday during this sermon series in Jude, we are singing Jude 24-25 (<u>you can listen here</u>). Pray together in response to God's Word. Thank God for what He has done, and what He has promised to do for His own. Give God the glory, and declare His greatness in prayer.
