



A Worship Discussion Guide for Individuals, Groups & Families for the week of November 24, 2024

Read the Bible passage aloud in your group meeting. This is a worship discussion guide, and our reflections and applications are grounded in Scripture. You do not need to work through the whole guide. Decide which points would be most helpful for your meeting, and use them as a starting point for your time together.

Warm Up

- **What is something you can only know with your heart? What can bring darkness to a human heart?**

II Corinthians 4:6 *Let Light Shine Out Of Darkness*

⁶For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

- **"Let light shine out of darkness" is a quote from the account of the creation recorded in Genesis 1:1-5. When God created light, what purposes did it serve?**

¹In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. ²The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters. ³And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. ⁴And God saw that the light was good. And God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

- **Throughout the Scripture, light is a common metaphor. What are some of the things light represents?**
- **Paul likens our hearts to the first day of creation. What happens when God shines His light in our hearts?**
- **What do you see when you behold the face of Jesus Christ?**
- **When did God first shine His light in your heart? What did He enable you to see?**
- **How do you need God to shine His light in your heart today?**
- **Pray together in response to God's Word.**
