



## A Worship Discussion Guide for Individuals, Groups & Families for the week of March 8, 2026

Read the Bible passage aloud in your group meeting. This is a worship discussion guide, and our reflections and applications are grounded in Scripture. You do not need to work through the whole guide. Decide which points would be most helpful for your meeting, and use them as a starting point for your time together.

### Ruth 4:18-22 Love Wins

<sup>18</sup> Now these are the generations of Perez: Perez fathered Hezron, <sup>19</sup> Hezron fathered Ram, Ram fathered Amminadab, <sup>20</sup> Amminadab fathered Nahshon, Nahshon fathered Salmon, <sup>21</sup> Salmon fathered Boaz, Boaz fathered Obed, <sup>22</sup> Obed fathered Jesse, and Jesse fathered David.

- 1.) Recording genealogies is common in Scripture (i.e. [1 Chronicles 2:5-15](#)). Even the birth of Jesus is located in the Biblical record of generations ([Luke 3:31-33](#)). What does this emphasis on genealogy tell us about God and His purposes?
- 2.) Jesus' genealogy includes three non-Jewish, foreign women: Tamar, Rahab and Ruth ([Matthew 1:3-6](#)). What does this say about God and His purposes? How have you been blessed by a God who undertakes this kind of mission? Read [Romans 11:17-18](#) for more insight.
- 3.) Just as the Lord brought Naomi from emptiness to fullness, so the Lord brought Israel from the unrest of the time of the Judges to a time of flourishing under King David's reign. And even more, the Lord will bring His people salvation through the Son of David, Jesus Christ ([Matthew 1:1](#)). Thank God together for the ways He has brought you from emptiness to fullness. Ask Him for the ways in which you need to be brought from emptiness to fullness.
