



## A Worship Discussion Guide for Individuals, Groups & Families for the week of June 21, 2026

Read the Bible passage aloud in your group meeting. This is a worship discussion guide, and our reflections and applications are grounded in Scripture. You do not need to work through the whole guide. Decide which points would be most helpful for your meeting, and use them as a starting point for your time together.

### John 3:16 *Perishing*

<sup>16</sup>“For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.

- Each Sunday, we participate in the sacrament of the Lord’s Supper. The communion liturgy we read reminds us that the Lord Himself instituted this sacrament. This week, we read from [I Corinthians 11:23-32](#). **What do these verses tell us about the spiritual danger we all face, and the Lord’s gracious provision?**
- Every service at WEPC includes a *Confession of Sin*. This week, we told the Lord together that we see how Christ suffered as our Substitute. [Read this week’s confession of sin](#) together. **In what specific ways did Jesus suffer in our place?**
- This week, Pastor Kevin Greene preached from [John 3:16](#). **What does Jesus mean by “perish”? What does Jesus propose to redeem us from perishing? Why would anyone perish?**
- This week in worship, the church commissioned the team that will serve and share the Good News with children during WEPC’s [Vacation Bible School](#). As an element of worship, commissioning always hearkens back to the promises and commands of Jesus to His disciples in [Matthew 28:18-20](#). **What do we see about trusting and following Jesus in these verses?**
- **How would you explain what Jesus saves us “from” and saves us “for” to a child?** (Remember that [Jesus seemed to really like childlike faith](#).)
- **Pray that hearts at WEPC will be made new.** Ask Him for faith to believe that He so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. Do you need to become a Christian? Be renewed as a follower of Jesus? To change, believe, or to repent? Hint: The answer is “Yes” and you can ask Jesus to meet you right now!
