SAFE SANCTUARY TRAINING

Be prepared to learn about this training which equips staff members and volunteers to understand the facts and misconceptions related to child sexual abuse, including the basic characteristics of an abuser, the grooming process of the offender, and the key indicators of child sexual abuse. There are two classes left: Monday, February 20, at 6:30 PM for individuals whose last name starts with the letter I through the letter Q, and Monday, March 20, at 6:30 PM for individuals whose last name starts with the letter R thru the letter Z. Please feel free to attend either session, if your situation warrants it. Both classes will be held in the St. John's room. This training is required for all members of the Safe Sanctuary team and is also open to all members of the Church.

150TH ANNIVERSARY HISTORY REFLECTIONS

The move from Mount Olivet Church to Downtown New Cumberland - 1873

Trinity Church is a daughter church of Mt. Olivet United Brethren in Christ Church, which was located adjacent to the Mount Olivet Cemetery. This is located about a mile south of the borough on the Old York Road next to the Capital City Airport. Mount Olivet Church was founded by "Circuit Riders" from the United Brethren in Christ Church in Mechanicsburg. These Circuit Riders would travel on horseback sharing the gospel and sacraments to rural areas in Central Pennsylvania. As they traveled the Circuit, they would perform weddings, baptisms and funerals for faithful people. These gatherings of Christian people would meet in homes for support, prayer and studying the Word of God. The United Brethren in Christ was a denomination formed by Philip William Otterbein in 1800 and ministered to German speaking immigrants who settled in Pennsylvania.

The Circuit Riders moved to form a congregation, known as Mt. Olivet United Brethren in Christ in 1855. Faithful people in Fairview Township and New Cumberland Borough were members of this new congregation. Those who lived in the borough had to travel to Mt. Olivet Church on horseback, buggy or walking to the church for worship, prayer meetings, and Bible studies. New Cumberland had been laid out as a village in 1814 and it was incorporated as a borough in 1832. As the years passed, it became apparent that there was a need for a Church of United Brethren in the borough limits. In 1873, (150 years ago) it was decided to build a separate church building in New Cumberland -- to minister to families who were already part of Mt. Olivet and also to attract new members in the growing town and to share the Gospel of Christ. The new church was built on Bridge Street between 4th and 5th street, where Trinity now stands. The move was fortuitous, for the church experienced significant growth and became the largest Protestant Church in the borough.

Mount Olivet United Brethren in Christ Church continued as a congregation until it was closed by the denomination in 1897 - 24 years after Trinity Church was founded. Today a historical marker, erected by John Morningstar indicates where Mt. Olivet Church used to stand. As you enter Mt. Olivet from Old York Rd, this marker is on the left. Each generation in Trinity Church faces new challenges and opportunities. The recent vote for "disaffiliation" from the United Methodist Church is an opportunity to share the Gospel of Christ here in New Cumberland and greater Harrisburg area, I believe that the Lord has opened a door for us, to be faithful in "making Disciples."

CIRCUIT RIDERS

Have you ever heard the term “circuit rider?” If not, and you did an online search, you’d find a bunch of references to motorcycles and cross-country motor bike races. Well, Mt. Olivet Church, the forerunner of Trinity Church was founded by a circuit rider but not the motorcycle kind!

In 1873 when Mt. Olivet Church was built, there were no motorcycles or cars on the road – often there weren’t even any roads. The circuit riders of 150 years ago were pastors who traveled on horseback to bring the word of God to people who primarily lived in rural areas. Mt. Olivet was established by a Scotch/Irish circuit rider, the Rev. Johnson Dickson. Pastor Dickson served the United Brethren in Christ circuit in eastern Cumberland County which included preaching-points in Mechanicsburg, Shoppe's Station (Shiremanstown), Wormleysburg, Mt Zion and Fairview.

At that time, a school house existed in Marsh Run and was located on what is now the southeastern corner of Mt. Olivet Cemetery. Parishioners began meeting at the schoolhouse for worship services and in 1860 it became a preaching-point for Pastor Dickson as he made his circuit rounds. Under Dicksons' leadership, a revival took place and the parishioners who met in the school decided to build a church – Mt. Olivet United Brethren in Christ Church. It was located in the area to the left of the cemetery entrance, off Old York Road.

Throughout 2023, we will celebrate the 150 years that Trinity Church has represented the word of God and ministered to the generations of people living in and around New Cumberland. Be sure to check-out the working display of artifacts that will be showcased in the Mt. Olivet Room.

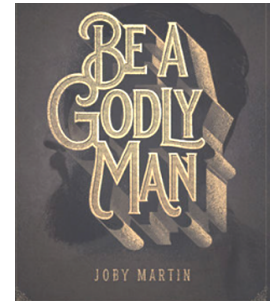
