
Loving Shepherd of thy Sheep


Celebrating Communion

At King of Glory we welcome all who believe Jesus Christ is present for and with us in the bread and wine.

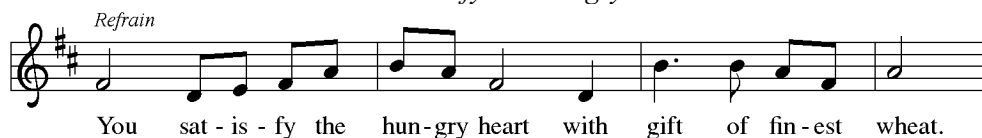

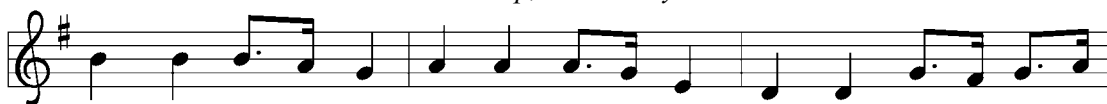
