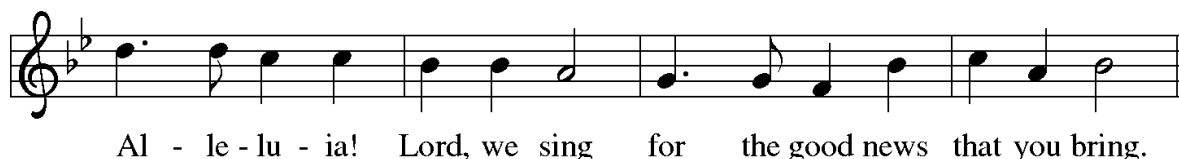
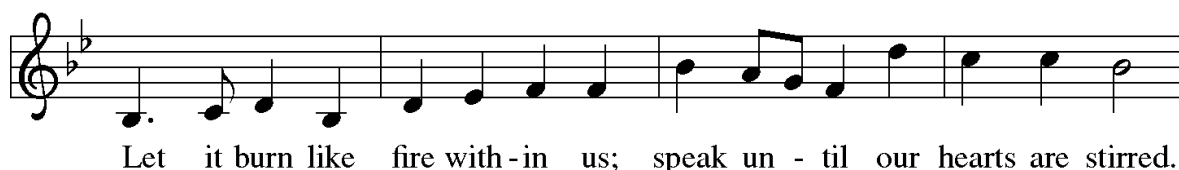

"Be Still, My Soul" is a globally cherished hymn that originated in 1752 Germany as a poem by Katharina von Schlegel, an 18th-century Protestant writer who infused the verses with themes of enduring earthly grief, letting go of control, and trusting in God's ultimate faithfulness. In 1855, the text crossed into Scotland when Jane Borthwick translated it into English for her book Hymns from the Land of Luther. The words were finally paired with its iconic music in 1927, when Welsh composer David Evans arranged the melody from Finnish composer Jean Sibelius's 1899 patriotic orchestral piece, Finlandia. This centuries-long journey created a powerful international masterpiece that continues to offer deep comfort to listeners worldwide today. Martin L. Green is a prolific American choral educator, conductor, and sacred music arranger.
