





flag football games after church on Super Bowl Sundays. The youth faced off with members of the Partners in Faith group.

























King of Glory has Midwestern roots, being funded by a cash gift and loan from Lutheran congregations in lowa.

Afghanistan, Bhutan, Burma, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Eretria, Iran, Iraq, and Syria




#### more RRM facts:

- oldest refugee was 60
- youngest was born ] day after move-in
- largest was a family of  $\,7\,$  requiring  $\,2\,$  apartments
- only lof the 39 families was of the Christian faith
- one family lived in a refugee camp 30 years before coming to Dallas



Our organ was custom-built by Manuel Rosales and dedicated in 1995.

It has 2,683 handmade pipes some as long as 16 feet others as short as 3/4 inch.







Our baptismal font came from a large, burled walnut tree in California.

The idea came from the architect who designed the

current sanctuary in the early 80's. A local craftsman was hired to hollow out the burl, sand blast it, and create a bronze basin to fit the hollow.





KOG has several core volunteers serving at South Park YMCA who:

shop weekly for toothbrushes, toothpaste, detergent, soap, deodorant, etc,

assemble 240 hygiene packets a week, and distribute the hygiene packets on Saturdays in the South Park Y parking lot.



# Our Bell Choir has 5 octaves of handbells and 3 octaves of hand chimes.

They have rung with the choir and numerous instruments in addition to our organ:

violin, harp, flute, French horn, cello, clarinet, percussion and during the Jazz service.

They have played at other venues like nursing homes, handbell music festivals and some even rang the National Anthem at a Rangers Game with hundreds of other handbell musicians!



King of Glory has donated over \$94,000 since 1984 to support Upbring S life-changing programs!

Last Christmas, KOG blessed 39 children at Foster In Texas - Dallas with over 90 Christmas gifts and gift cards.

This Easter, KOG provided Easter Baskets for 44 children.





King of Glory members will help package 25,000 meals.

In the past 5 years, KOG will have helped package 50,000 meals.

King of Glory has a long history with the NT-NL Synod's Mission Endowment Fund (MEF).

MEF was formed in 1995 & is the grant giving ministry of the Synod. It has given over \$1 million in "non-brick and mortar" grants,

& in 2023, awarded grants supporting 21 synod congregations and organizations.



KOG has partnered with North Dallas Shared Ministries since 2006 and has provided over \$334,000 in support. NDSM is an interfaith community of volunteers who:

- Promotes wellness and financial independence.
- · Provides emergency assistance.
- · Helps access programs to achieve long-term stability.



King of Glory's first female council president was Freida Hesla, appointed in 1975.

Female lay liturgists were introduced in 1979.

Norma Cooper became King of Glory's first female associate pastor in 1996.

KOG has partnered with Richardson Area Interfaith Habitat since 1989 to help build houses and help make home ownership a reality.

Today, KOG is 1 of 10 congregations that make up RAIH. RAIH just finished and dedicated its 45<sup>th</sup> house on June 17<sup>th</sup>.







In early 2000, KOG members parked off-site for almost 1½ years during the construction of the Education Building, Atrium, and Activity Center.



Members parked at Hillcrest Academy on Park Central Dr. for Sunday School and to ride a shuttle bus to and from King of Glory's campus for worship.

Although it meant added travel time, most members enjoyed their time riding the buses and getting to connect with other KOG families and friends. Kids especially loved riding the bus!



In the City for Good was founded by KOG member, Terry Kittleson, in 1998.



In the City for Good partners with leaders of charitable organizations in South Dallas

to feed the hungry, fight drug addiction, & support early childhood education programs.



In 1986, KOG was one of 5 founding congregations of the Dallas Downtown Family Shelter, now known as Family Gateway.

Annette Strauss, then-mayor of Dallas, personally requested King of Glory's help in the shelter's development.





Family Gateway is the lead agency in addressing family homelessness in Dallas & Collin Counties.

Family Gateway also provides stability and life-changing supportive services to families with children.



In 1992, King of Glory was a founding member of Dallas Area Interfaith (DAI).

DAI is a non-partisan, multi-ethnic, multiissue group of religious institutions, schools and other non-profits in the DFW area.



#### Dallas Area Interfaith (DAI) works together with member institutions to identify common problems and find workable solutions with the goal of stimulating positive systemic changes within democracy and society.
