The machines are delivered to the Sewing Machine Project in

Columbia, Missouri, a part of Mobility Worldwide, a charity that makes mobility carts for leg or motion impaired people in third world countries. At the Sewing Machine Project, they have a team of experienced volunteers that repair, recondition, clean and oil the donated machines so that they are in excellent working condition. They are then boxed for shipment and packed with fabric, sewing accessories like scissors, extra needles, spools of thread, and other sewing notions. They are shipped to developing countries with instructions impoverished native women can repair or make clothing for their families or start a small seamstress business to support their family. Many have very little or no other source of income. Most machines go to Africa and South America with some going to schools in Kenya and South Africa to train people to sew professionally. Did you know?

- The 161 Veteran graves at St. Trinity date back 150 years and include 18 who served in the Civil War.
- A few graves are actually just markers for those missing or killed in action, but unrecovered.
- Of particular note is Louis T. Hunt, Civil War Medal of Honor recipient buried in Old Section 5 (map located on website).
- The first Veteran burial at St. Trinity was Iguatz Matt, a Civil War soldier interred on Christmas Eve in 1873. He was 30 at the time of his death.
- The youngest Veteran at St. Trinity is 20-year-old Roger Wilson Chasteen, PFC CO A1 BN 5 Marine, who was killed in action in Vietnam, and buried on May 22, 1967.
- There are Veterans in St. Trinity from every branch of the service, even dating back to the Army-Air Force, which was the predecessor to the current Air Force.

That's quite a history, and we hope you will join us on May 25, to recognize their service and their sacrifice. We thank the Scouts and ALL veterans for their service!

# LIFE MINISTRY - AUTONOMY



On July 4, 1776, Americans declared their independence from England and the phrase "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness" became America's creed of Lutherans freedom. They took up arms to make that independence a reality. Thomas lefterson correctly stated these rights come from our Creator. Our Constitution is Jefferson correctly stated these rights come from our Creator. Our Constitution is designed to work for a society embracing Christian values. But what happens

when that society turns its back on God? Personal autonomy fills the void.

Personal autonomy is a popular term meaning "self-directing freedom and moral independence." It's often used when discussing life issues such as abortion, euthanasia, cohabitation before marriage and the spectrum of LGBTQ concerns. Those opposing Christian values first change the language to make what is sinful appear normal, fulfilling and moral. So personal autonomy is their sanitized way of saying "I have the right to do whatever I want." Personal autonomy is self-centered rebellion against God.

Ironically, those who celebrate personal autonomy are the ones most enslaved to sin. They deceive themselves into thinking that living outside of God's standards is freedom. If they were honest with themselves, they would realize that a self-centered life doesn't fill their spiritual void. Christians enjoy a true freedom from slavery to sin, which is exactly what causes such hostility and animosity from those embracing personal autonomy.

We are in a cultural and spiritual war. We've seen open hostility towards Christianity from government, media and educational institutions. Following the Dobbs decision, dozens of pregnancy help centers were vandalized while the Department of Justice turned a blind eye. Super Bowl half-time entertainment and the Grammy awards celebrated Satanism and lewdness. The contrast between Christian values and a new paganism has never been more obvious.

The early church flourished in such a pagan society. As persecution increased, so did the spread of Christianity. As Christians, we have a declaration of independence from sin, death and the devil that is written in Christ's blood and sealed with a cross and an empty tomb. As Ephesians 6:13 says, "Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day and having done all to stand firm." It's your call to independence.



The boys tennis team took first and second in both singles and doubles in the individual District Tournament, and won the team District Championship, as well! Owen Kinder is the Singles District







# **EVANGELISM MINISTRY**



Lutheran Hour Ministries (LHM) worked with The Barna Group (a research firm) to answer this question: "What are the rituals and relationships that turn a Christian home into a sacred space?" LHM shared those answers in their workshop, **Households of Faith.** 

**Households of Faith** examined Christian households including singles, married with kids/no kids, widowed, divorced, and multigenerational. Certain characteristics of a spiritually vibrant household emerged. Those characteristics were centered in developing relationships with non-Christians through Christian hospitality.

They concluded that a spiritually vibrant home is one where Christian households build a sacred space to gather together for regular home devotions, prayer, and Bible study. They attend worship services/Bible class at least two times per month or more as a family. They also get together to eat with family or friends regularly. In other words, Christian households become spiritually vibrant through practicing Christian hospitality. They invite others to their private "space" for movies, game night, meals, or sleepovers. They share the love of God by seeking out people who they can share life with, especially those who are alone, non-Christian, or far from family.
