In November, our preschoolers will learn about Moses, crossing the Red Sea, and the Ten Commandments. The focus of these lessons is that God has a plan for His people, God helps us in times of trouble, and God provides all that we need. God also knows what's best for us! ### LIFE MINISTRY- CLOUDY LENSES AND DIRTY WATER



Ever had cataract surgery? If so, you know that the cataract clouded the lens of your eye and colors became rather dingy, and shapes became blurry. Your new lens transformed your world into crisp, clear images. In a similar way, our post-Christian culture has developed spiritual cataracts. It has clouded our ability to discern right from wrong. Everything has become shades of gray with no distinct boundaries. As a greater percentage of our population falls away from Christianity, it has embraced a clouded lens through which the world is viewed.

Our most divisive issues are moral ones regarding life, marriage, death, and gender. It has become increasingly difficult for the opposing sides to communicate because they see the world through very different lenses. In fact, those who oppose God's truth embrace their clouded lenses because they don't have to confront their own lack of moral integrity and they deceive themselves into thinking that integrity is not important anyway.

Proverbs 25:26 says: "Like a muddied spring or a polluted fountain is a righteous man who gives way before the wicked." This verse summarizes much of what has happened in our culture over the past sixty years. Christians failed to stand up for what was right, and they gave way before evil. Cataracts develop so gradually that one doesn't notice the change. In the same way, our moral culture declined slowly, but as Christianity diminished, the decline greatly accelerated. Prayer was banned in public schools. Over time, abortion, gay marriage, euthanasia, and recreational drugs were legalized. Now children are being taught that they can change to the opposite sex. Our culture has degraded from a polluted fountain to an open sewer. Our spiritual cataracts are definitely clouding our discernment.

In 2024, Missouri voters will decide if their state constitution should be changed to include abortion as a right. What lens will voters use in making their decisions? Will it be the clouded lens of "a woman's right to choose"? Will it be God's lens that sees all human life as precious from conception to natural death? Again, we are being called to make a stand against evil. Ultimately, we will make a choice between integrity or further polluting our culture. What lens will you choose?
