NEXT STEPS FOR OUR NEW GOVERNANCE MODEL

On Monday, September 11, the Voters Assembly of our congregation met and adopted a new set of bylaws. These affect how our church is run in terms of administration and communication. What this does not affect is our time together in the Divine Service on the weekends, the theological standards of our congregation, or how the Board of Elders oversee the spiritual life of our Peace community.

So, what does it affect? Previously, we found no permanent situation that looked strategically toward the future of the congregation. We also found that many of our different efforts are "siloed," meaning that different groups went forward with their objectives without really looking at the larger picture of our congregational life together and in the community. To address these issues, the Church Council has a new focus, which is to consider the future of the congregation and how we might pursue what is optimal. The structure also puts many of the programs of the congregation under more direct oversight of the staff, not to micromanage things, but to increase communication between groups and to help keep the "big picture" in mind as we go forward together.

The staff is currently considering how the new structure has shifted each person's roles and then to help clarify the purpose and place of each of our programs and efforts to best serve our members, the community around us, and the larger Church. Every board, guild, and committee will proceed as usual for now until we can meet and see how best to proceed from where they are at and what they want to accomplish. We won't get everything right on the first try, so we pray your patience in advance, and your forgiveness where correction is needed. In the end, we pray these changes will help us keep Christ central in all things and draw us closer together as a community in an increasingly anti-Christian culture. God grant it!



LIFE MINISTRY - WHAT CAN YOU PUT IN A BOX?



What can you put in a box? Sometimes a baby when it's a Safe Haven Baby Box. According to the Safe Haven Baby Box website:

"A Baby Box is a safety device provided for under state's Safe Haven Law and legally permits a mother in crisis to safely, securely, and anonymously surrender if they are unable to care for their newborn. A Baby Box is installed in an exterior wall of a designated fire station or hospital. It has an exterior door that automatically locks upon placement of a newborn inside the Baby Box, and an interior door which allows a medical staff member to secure the surrendered newborn from inside the designated building."

The first baby box in Missouri was dedicated on August 8th at the Mehlville Fire Station located at 5434 Telegraph Road. It started when Robert Gau contacted State Representative Jim Murphy and asked to meet with him over coffee. He had read about the baby box program in the state of Indiana where there have been twenty-five infants who have been saved through this program and 130 infants saved nationwide. Mr. Gau wanted such a program to be started in Missouri and he personally paid for the first baby box. These boxes cost around \$12,000. In addition, several contracting firms donated their materials and services for installation. The program is solely funded by donations, not state funds.

Rep. Murphy sponsored the necessary legislation, which passed through the legislature and was signed by the governor. However, numerous codes and regulations from different government departments needed to be satisfied before the baby box program could be implemented. Lt. Governor Mike Kehoe navigated this process and cleared the way within a month's time so that the box could be installed. The Mehlville Fire Department gave its full support in starting this program.

Monica Kelsey started Safe Haven Baby Boxes because of her personal story. Monica's mother had been raped in 1972, and abandoned her child shortly after birth. When Monica read about a baby box program sponsored by a church in South Africa, she knew she had to start such a program in her home state of Indiana. The baby box on Telegraph Road is the 157th one in the nation.

There were many different people who made the Baby Box program happen. It started with people who saw a need and took the time and initiative to do something to help. It was advanced by others who value human life and were willing to sacrifice time, work and money for the effort. Jesus said: "Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me." Matthew 25: 40


Running with purpose....The cross country team raised more than \$400 for The Covering House, a St. Louisbased organization that aids survivors of human trafficking. students and their

parents logged 409 miles to support the cause.


