#### **GRAVE & HEADSTONE PLACEMENT**

In some cemeteries, headstones face different directions. In others, they are all oriented in the same way. Sometimes, the topography of the cemetery acreage dictates how the cemetery plots are divided and laid out. Cemeteries may also be laid out with ease of maintenance in mind. St. Trinity is laid out such that when you are standing on a road, you are generally able to read the headstones in that section, which is more aesthetically pleasing than looking at the blank backs of them. A quick internet search yields many other thoughts and traditions which influence the way grave plots face, and why someone might choose a plot based on its' orientation.

- The tradition of orienting graves to the east has many origins, including celebration of each new day, or the Egyptian and Greek traditions of worshipping their sun god.
- Some Catholic cemeteries place graves with the feet facing the altar of the parish church.
- An old Jewish custom was to place graves such that the feet pointed toward the cemetery entrance. This put loved ones in the perfect position to rise and leave the cemetery when the resurrection occurred. Another Jewish custom faces graves to the west, toward Israel.
- Islamic graves are oriented perpendicular to Mecca and then the deceased is laid in the grave on his or her right side facing Mecca.

Lutherans, and Christians in general, would observe the tradition of facing east when possible, but not for the same reasons as the early Egyptians and Greeks. We look to Matthew 24:27, where it is written "For as lightning that comes from the east is visible even in the west, so will be the coming of the Son of Man."

So, if you are choosing a casket burial and want to have the best possible view of our returning Lord and Savior, make sure your feet are pointing east in your final resting place. Just a thought...there are many east-facing plots available at St. Trinity Cemetery!!

#### LIFE MINISTRY - SOUND OF FREEDOM



In 1852 a book was published that energized people in the United States to work for the abolition of slavery. *Uncle Tom's Cabin* struck an emotional nerve like nothing before and escalated the tensions between the pro-slavery states and those opposing slavery. Theater productions of the play brought further awareness of the miserable plight of slaves and hardened the resolve of the abolitionist movement to end the practice.

Something similar happened in early July with the release of the movie Sound of Freedom. It's based on the true story of DHS agent Tim Ballard who quit his job with this agency in order to complete his personal mission of rescuing two Honduran children from sex trafficking. The movie deals with a horrendous subject and though it has no graphic scenes, it might be more than some people can handle.

Yet the topic must be brought to light because it's one of the most evil practices in our society and we as Christians have an obligation to address this head on. Sex trafficking is a multi-billion-dollar business with the United States being the main consumer of the prostitution and pornographic films produced from trafficked individuals. Unfortunately, St. Louis is a major hub of trafficking because of its central location and major highways running through it.

The producers of Sound of Freedom found out just how powerful those promoting sex trafficking are. The movie had been completed in 2018, but Walt Disney Company refused to release this film for five years. Many in Hollywood are supporting the trafficking industry. Finally, Angel Studios acquired the rights to the film and marketed it with a very limited budget. Sound of Freedom shattered all expectations while competing against the latest Tom Cruise and Indiana Jones films.

God used many Christians in this story from Tim Ballard, the hero of the movie, to Jim Caviezel, the actor who played Ballard's part. The producer, Eduardo Verastegui is another openly professing Christian who is committed to exposing the trafficking industry with the goal of ending it. Many Christians prayed for the success of this film while others bought tickets to support it.

That's only the beginning. We need to encourage those who struggle with an addiction to porn to seek help. Parents need to keep close tabs on their children's use of computers and cell phones since these devices provide access to websites where child predators stalk their victims. We also need to let our elected officials know that ending human trafficking needs to be a priority in our society. As Tim Ballard said: "God's children are not for sale."


