

III. The Legal Situation for Home Schooling



A. Option #1 - - Homeschooling under the homeschool statute.

- 1. Teach the required subjects for the required time.
- 2. Maintain records as evidence of instruction.
- 3. Submit a semi-annual progress report.
- 4. Ensure your student has access to library facilities.
- 5. Test your child annually.

If your student does not perform well enough on the test to meet the public school standard for advancing to the next grade — the school district will decide if your child should be put in a public school, receive handicapped services, or have instruction support for homeschooling at your expense.

B. Option #2 - - Join S.C.A.I.H.S.

1. Join the South Carolina Association of Independent Home Schools.

 - 1. Parents may teach their children at home by becoming members of an association for home schools which has at least 50 members.
 - 2. Bona fide membership & continuing compliance with the Standards of the associations exempt the home school from the further requirements of #1.
 - 3. Community Bible Church Christian Academy is an association that it is both a <u>private</u> and a <u>religiously based</u> association for members of the church only.
