HOWEVER



OPEN THAT BIBLE... AGAIN!

This week we learned about Matthew 7:15-20

Watch out for false prophets. They come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ferocious wolves. By their fruit you will recognize them. Do people pick grapes from thornbushes, or figs from thistles? Likewise, every good tree bears good fruit, but a bad tree bears bad fruit. A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, and a bad tree cannot bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Thus, by their fruit you will recognize them.

STEP 1

STEP 2


Draw pieces of fruit in the basket below. Write down the names of those people on each piece of fruit.

STEP 3

Ask yourself if the people you listed are good influences on you or if they lead you away from what God teaches.

STEP 4

If they are good influences, draw a smiley face on the fruit; if they are not, draw a frowning face.



Finally, take a moment to reflect on the fruit you drew with smiley faces and think about how you can spend more time with those people. For the fruit with frowning faces, think about how you can limit your time with those people or be a positive influence on them.
