

Delight

I was recently reminded that an early proponent of Unitarianism in our country thought that we should practice "charity, forbearance, and a delight in the virtues of different sects."

When William Ellery Channing wrote these words in 1819, he was arguing that, while the Unitarian faith has

a set of beliefs that set it apart from traditional Christianity, that it was not those beliefs that made our tradition distinctive. What made us distinctive was our appreciation of the diversity of faith. And a marker of our maturity in practicing our faith was an attitude of curiosity that would lead to delight in what other religions were discovering was true.

For Channing, the censure and condemnation of others for their incorrect beliefs reflected a kind of backwardness. He argued against a sense of superiority within our tradition, and warned that we should at least recognize danger in any elation with the belief of our own correctness. Charity was required, and forbearance, and the discovery of virtue. And real delight that others were finding their own way to truth.

It isn't easy to build a multifaith, multicultural congregation. We try to find ways to share in worship that moves the heart, soothes the soul, challenges the intellect, encourages the development of virtue (including generosity, compassion, humility, humor, etc., etc., etc., etc.,).

We share a song. We offer a prayer. We hear a poem. We do a little chair yoga. We make an offering. We listen to music. We breathe into silence.

What effect might it have on Unitarian Universalism?


Who has the expertise to advise on the winners?



DENOMINATIONAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE (DAC) Barry Nobel, Chair



At General Assembly (GA) 2023, Unitarian Universalists will take an initial vote on proposed changes to Article II of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) Bylaws, which includes the current UUA Purposes, Principles, sources, and clauses on inclusion and freedom of belief. The UUA Board of Trustees encourages you to read the full proposal from the Article II Study Commission and get more information about the process.

The UUA's goal is to maximize discussion and engagement with this proposal, which addresses the foundational values and purposes of our faith community. Until April 30, 2023, any Unitarian Universalist may submit suggestions and ideas through an online form for ways they recommend modifying the Article II Study Commission proposal (PDF). Each suggestion or idea should describe specific language changes to the proposal, explain the reason, and be limited to a single section of the proposal. Individuals may submit multiple suggestions and ideas.

All qualifying suggestions will be posted for public chat discussion at discuss.uua.org, starting after April 22. Suggestions must be received by April 30 in order to be posted. Additionally, the UUA Board of Trustees will host public discussion workshops on May 11, 18, and 21, 2023, to review suggestions and ideas. These rounds of public discussion will inform the way amendments are prioritized for discussion and voting at General Assembly.

Submit your suggestions and ideas on the Article II proposal now!

NOTE: Submitting suggestions and ideas through this form is for the purpose of public discussion, and does NOT submit an amendment which could be voted on at General Assembly. Amendments eligible for voting must be separately submitted by delegates through the online delegate platform, which will be available when the GA final agenda is published. Delegate amendments which are based on suggestions or ideas which had been previously discussed through this process are more likely to be prioritized for discussion and voting at General Assembly.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE

The Nominating Committee is pleased to present its nominees for the June 2023 election cycle to the Unitarian Universalist Congregation at Shelter Rock. These candidates share a willingness to give their time and talents to serving their fellow congregants. They were chosen because of their demonstrated leadership and sustained commitment to our UU Principles.

The Nominating Committee spoke with members of the Board of Trustees, and with our Ministers, in order to gain a better understanding of the preferred skill sets and interpersonal qualities expected of candidates. We discussed all candidates received from electronic and mail-in submissions and those generated by members of the Nominating Committee itself.

After carefully reviewing the qualifications of each of the candidates and considering the current needs of the Board of Trustees, as well as next year's Nominating Committee, we propose to the Congregation the slate of candidates (see below) and recommend that these nominees be elected at the Annual Meeting on Sunday, June 4, 2023.

If members of the Congregation wish to propose an additional person (who has been a member of UUCSR for three consecutive years at the time the term of office commences) for nomination for any of the positions listed below, they will need to adhere to the process according to Bylaw Article VI Nominations:

Section 6.4 Additional Nominations

Additional nominations for all elective positions, including those for the Nominating Committee itself, may be made by written petition of at least thirty (30) members and with the consent of the nominee(s). Such petition(s), along with the nominees' qualifications, must be filed with the Secretary not less than thirty (30) days prior to the meeting at which elections will take place. Such additional nominations and qualifications shall be included in the notice of the meeting at which elections will take place.

Should a vacancy occur in the proposed slate within 30 days of the Annual Meeting, the submission of nominee(s) for this position by petition will be allowed when submitted.

No nominations shall be valid except those carried out by the above procedures.


