

AWANA Clubs achieve this goal by building bridges with families and communities to reach boys and girls with the Gospel of Christ and train them to serve Him.

Sept. - May

Awana stands for "Approved workmen are not ashamed." This acronym is based on 2 Timothy 2:15 – "Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a workman who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth." (NIV)

Nightly Activities:

Snack - Clubbers
have a time of fellowship
with leaders and other kids
while having a light snack
during the nightly program.





- Handbook time Clubbers
 recite the sections or verses of
 their handbooks they have
 memorized since the previous club
 meeting. They will be in small
 groups reciting verses to a
 "listener".
- Council Time Clubbers hear Bible stories, learn life lessons, and are presented the Gospel.
- Game Time Clubbers play organized games while learning discipline, team cooperation, and good sportsmanship.



AWANA Store:

AWANA store is held periodically where clubbers are able to "spend" earned bucks to purchase toys, snacks, and other fun items. They earn AWANA bucks during the year by attending, being in uniform, having their handbook & Bible, saying handbook sections, or bringing a friend who is new to the AWANA Clubs.

General Rules:

- Be on time; Be in uniform; Be obedient; Be ready
- Bring handbook and Bible
- Come prepared to say verses or sections from handbook
- Say all section parts, in one continuous recitation, word perfect (only two helps consisting of three words or less each are allowed per section)
- Children need to complete sections, verses each club night
- Clubbers must wear tennis or athletic shoes and socks. Bare feet or open-toed shoes are not allowed.
- Respect leaders , volunteers and other clubbers at all times

How you can support the AWANA clubs:

- Volunteer to serve. Even occasionally listening to sections will bless you and the others in your child's club.
- Pray for the AWANA clubs for the children and the workers.
- Help make sure your clubber is in the proper uniform.
- Learn scripture along with your child.
- Remind child to use restroom before club and leave the gum, candy, and toys at home.
- Take a few minutes every day to help your clubber study and recite the verses from their book.

Share your personal understanding and insights with your children on a level that is unique to your relationship with them.



Discipline is the process of teaching acceptable behavior and self control.

We use the following 3 count AWANA discipline model for problems arising on the same club meeting night:

- 1. Verbal counseling about conduct by leader or director.
- 2. Child will be counseled by commander about conduct.
- 3. Two leaders will report child's behavior to parents.

Your child will be suspended for the next club meeting and be welcomed back again when they can behave according to club rules and expectations.



Fees & Dues:

Please do not allow fees or dues keep your child from attending.
Scholarships are available to those who need help.
Fees and dues offset costs for uniforms, books, awards, supplies, and AWANA Store.

Sick Policy:

 Please ensure that your child is not ill prior to attending AWANA club night. We will follow COVID-19 guidelines to keep EVERYONE safe!

Weather Policy:

In case of a severe weather advisory for our area, all church evening activities will be cancelled. Other cancellations will be determined by church leadership and an announcement will be sent via email, phone, text or posted on our children's ministry church website www.firstbaptistrockville.org.
