

Living Wisely 3rd in the "James" Series James 1:5-8 May 7, 2023 Pastor Mickey Klink

## Introduction

In this passage, God teaches us about wisdom and exhorts us to pursue a life lived in accordance with God.

## The Text: James 1:5-8

1) One of the primary virtues of a "mature" Christian is wisdom (v. 5).

<u>Lofty Definition</u>: Wisdom as a way of life that is in harmony with both the created order and God's redemptive work in Christ.

<u>On-the-Ground Definition</u>: Wisdom is living life in accordance with God.

- Wisdom guides the **mind** of the Christian to think God's thoughts.
- Wisdom guides the eyes of the Christian to see God's will.
- Wisdom guides the *heart* of the Christian to desire God's love.
- Wisdom guides the **hands** of the Christian to do God's commands.
- 2) The first and foundational step toward wisdom is believing not doubting that God is the source and supplier of wisdom (vv. 6-8).

## Sunday Text Questions James 1:5-8 May 7, 2023 Pastor Mickey Klink

Read the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.

1) Wisdom can be succinctly defined as living life in accordance with God. What does wisdom look like in practice?

2) V. 5 makes clear that wisdom comes from God. How does God give us wisdom, and how can we know that God's gift of wisdom has been received?

- 3) Why is James concerned about doubt (vv. 6-8), and how can we know if a doubter is honestly wrestling with sincere questions of faith or unwilling to accept God's answers as true and final?
- 4) How is a wise person the opposite of a "double-minded" person who has divided allegiances?
- 5) In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?
