## Introduction

1)	Why is it common for people, even Christians, to blame God for their problems or when things go bad in their life?
2)	How does v. 17 teach us not only about the character of God but also about how every single thing in the world is a gift from God? How might this truth change how we look at everything we have and see?
3)	How is our salvation the clearest example of God's supreme generosity toward us, and what, if anything, does v. 18 suggest about how one receives God's salvation?
4)	If we know that God does not give us evil but only good things, how can we relate our moments of suffering trials to God in a way that avoids the concern of James?
5)	In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?
