Introduction

On Reformation Sunday, we celebrate the church's testimony and reflect on a key theme: hospitality.

The life of Tim Keller reminds us that gracious hospitality is expected in the life of the believer.

 - Statistics about New York City and Redeemer Church
 - a. Evangelicals living in New York (1989): 9,000
 - b. Evangelicals living in New York (2019): 80,000
 - c. Redeemer Attendance, Summer 2001: 2,800
 - d. Redeemer Attendance, September 16, 2001: 5,600
 - e. Redeemer Churches planted, as of 2021: 748

• The surprising purpose of the Prodigal Son parable (vv. 31-32).

- Christians ought to have a posture of radical, grace-filled hospitality toward all peoples.
 - a. Towards one another \rightarrow a spirit of ecumenicalism (love one another)
 - b. Towards non-Christians → a spirit of hospitality (love your neighbor)
