The King's Kindness
46th in the "Samuel" Series
2 Samuel 9:1-13
May 26, 2024
Pastor Casey Ehlers

Introduction: As God kept good on his promises to King David (2 Sam. 8), David will keep good on his promises.

- 1) David's promise to Mephibosheth is a continuation of his covenant/oath with Jonathan (and Saul) (vv.1-13).

*"But show me **unfailing kindness** like the Lord's kindness as long as I live, so that I may not be killed, and do not ever cut off your kindness from my family—not even when the Lord has cut off every one of David's enemies from the face of the earth."* [Jonathan to David] (1 Samuel 20:14-17)

"Now swear to me by the LORD that you will not kill off my descendants or wipe out my name from my father's family." [Saul to David] (1 Samuel 24:21)

*"'Don't be afraid,' David said to him, 'for I will surely show you **kindness** for the sake of your father Jonathan. I will restore to you all the land that belonged to your grandfather Saul, and you will always eat at my table.'"* [David to Mephibosheth] (2 Samuel 9:7)

- 2) The King's table welcomes enemies.

- 3) The King's table welcomes the powerless and weak.

Response: Praise God that...

"At just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:6-8)

Sunday Text Questions

2 Samuel 9:1-13

May 26, 2024

Pastor Casey Ehlers

Read the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.

- 1) Have you ever been surprised by the generosity of a stranger, or even an enemy? What did that look like?
- 2) David's kindness stems from God's kindness (v. 3). What practices could you adopt to look for ways to show God's kindness in your life and relationships?
- 3) The King's table welcomes enemies. What does this look like in your life? What does this look like in an election year?
- 4) The King's table welcomes the weak and powerless. What does this look like in your life?
- 5) How is this text a shadow of the Gospel of Christ?
- 6) In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?

Further study this week: Passages related to the message of this week's text: 1 Samuel 20 & 24 (Mon); Matthew 5:1-12 (Tues); Romans 3:1-20 (Wed); Romans 3:21-31 (Thurs); Romans 5 (Fri).
