2 Samuel 11:1-27
June 16, 2024

Introduction

In this text, God warns us about the destructive power of sin and exhorts us to pursue his goodness and grace.

1) The calling of every Christian is to be a “slave of righteousness.”

Romans 6:15-18: ¹⁵ *What then? Shall we sin because we are not under the law but under grace? By no means!* ¹⁶ *Don't you know that when you offer yourselves to someone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one you obey—whether you are slaves to sin, which leads to death, or to obedience, which leads to righteousness?* ¹⁷ *But thanks be to God that, though you used to be slaves to sin, you have come to obey from your heart the pattern of teaching that has now claimed your allegiance.* ¹⁸ *You have been set free from sin and have become slaves to righteousness.*

2) David's unwise and sinful actions in 2 Samuel 11 serve as a pastoral warning to Christians today.

- a) David was not living in harmony with his royal identity (v. 1).
- b) David allowed the sinful desires of his heart to rule over him (vv. 2-4).
- c) David did not deal with his sin but hid with it in the darkness (vv. 5-27).

1 John 1:5-10: ⁵ *This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all.* ⁶ *If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth.* ⁷ *But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.*

⁸ *If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.* ⁹ *If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.* ¹⁰ *If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us.*

Response

Christian, please the Lord with your avoidance of sin and pursuit of the goodness and grace of righteousness.

Sunday Text Questions

2 Samuel 11:1-27

June 16, 2024

- 1) How comfortable and willing are Christians to talk about sin in their lives? How comfortable and willing are you to talk about sin in your life?
- 2) How would you diagnose the spiritual sickness that is displayed in David's actions in 2 Samuel 11?
- 3) Allow David's sinful testimony to be a mirror into your own heart. How does this text point at the sinful potential or sinful tendencies in your own life? Be honest!
- 4) Read Romans 6:15-18. What does it look like to live as a slave to righteousness and not a slave to sin?
- 5) Read Romans 1:5-10. How does the apostle John teach us to walk in the light and not the darkness, to deal with our own sinfulness and not deny it? What does that look like in practice?
- 6) Is there a spiritual struggle or battle with sin that you believe you should share and discuss with your small group? Take a moment to pray and encourage one another.
- 7) In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?
