**Exhort One Another**  
51<sup>st</sup> in the “Samuel” Series  
2 Samuel 14

### Introduction

In this text God teaches us the importance of “exhorting one another” toward spiritual holiness and health.

- (1) One of the effects of sin we all experience is strife and division in our relationships (v. 1).
- (2) Sometimes reconciliation requires a third party and compassionate wisdom (vv. 2-3).
- (3) Christians should “exhort one another (Heb 3:13) with compassion and wisdom.
  - “Better is open rebuke than hidden love. Faithful are the wounds of a friend . . . ” (Prov. 27:5–6).
  - “Pay attention to yourselves! If your brother or sister sins, rebuke them, and if they repent, forgive them” (Luke 17:3).
  - “. . . if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should restore him in a spirit of gentleness. Keep watch on yourself, lest you too be tempted” (Gal. 6:1).
  - “Exhort one another every day, as long as it is called ‘today,’ that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin” (Heb. 3:13).
  - “We urge you, brothers and sisters, admonish the unruly . . . be patient with everyone” (1 Thess. 5:14).

How should a Christian confront another Christian regarding a sin or spiritual issue in their life?

- (1) Confront yourself first.
- (2) Confront for love’s sake.
- (3) Confront at the right time.
- (4) Confront the most important thing.
- (5) Confront with confidentiality and accountability.

## Sunday Text Questions

2 Samuel 14

July 14, 2024

Read the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.

- 1) Share a time when you were confronted regarding an issue or sin in your life by someone who loved you and had your best interest in mind.
- 2) Why do you think David was unwilling to meet with his son, Absalom, and yet willing to respond mercifully to the story (parable) told by the woman regarding her murderous son?
- 3) What issues or sins in the life of a person you know well would cause you to lovingly and wisely confront them?
- 4) What, if anything, would keep you from confronting a close Christian friend or family member, and are those reasons biblical?
- 5) Read the five ways a Christian should confront another Christian in the sermon notes. Do you disagree with any of those suggestions? Which of those is the most difficult?
- 6) Is there someone in your life that the Lord might be encouraging you to confront in love? Are you willing to be confronted by someone who loves you?
- 7) In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?
