

28th in the "Psalms" Series Psalm 28 August 11, 2024 Pastor Mickey Klink

Introduction: This passage offers a Christian perspective on how we can and should deal with suffering.
In this Psalm, we are given a Christian perspective on the proper ways to deal with suffering. (1) Seek the Lord when you suffer (v. 1a).
(2) No matter the suffering you face, you must believe that the Lord is your Rock (v. 1b).
(3) When you pray to God for help, sincerely place your suffering into God's care (vv. 1c-2).
(4) As you endure suffering of any kind, root yourself in the assurance of your faith in the Lord (vv. 6-8)

Lord, be our Shepherd and carry us forever.


Sunday Text Questions

Psalm 28 August 11, 2024 Pastor Mickey Klink

Read the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.

1)	Why do you think the Psalms spend so much time showing us the prayers of people who call upon God in times of need and suffering?
2)	What is your initial response when you face difficulty or suffering, and how quickly do you seek the Lord in prayer and for help?
3)	The Psalmist calls God his "Rock" in v. 1. What does that mean, and do you believe that God is the Rock in your life?
4)	Are you able to give the Lord your suffering, finding a sense of peace in the midst of what you endure, or do you carry the burden on your own as you seek to solve it?
5)	What issue are you facing now that burdens you or is causing you to suffer? If you are open and willing, share it with your small group and receive prayer.
6)	Even if you are not suffering right now, how does this passage prepare you for future suffering or help you minister to those who are currently suffering?
7)	In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?

Further study this week: Passages related to the message of this week's text: 1 John 5:13-14 (Mon); 2 Timothy 1:12 (Tues); Hebrews 10:22 (Wed); Psalm 23:4 (Thurs); Hebrews 6:11 (Fri).
