

The Lord Had Determined

54th in the "Samuel" Series 2 Samuel 17 August 18, 2024 Pastor Mickey Klink

Introduction: In this text, God shepherds us to believe and trust in the ministry of his almighty and ever-present providence.

(1) The providence of God is the almighty power of God that guides all things according to his will (vv. 1-14).

<u>Prov 21:1</u>: In the Lord's hand the king's heart is a stream of water that he channels toward all who please him.

<u>Prov 16:9</u>: The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps.

Heidelberg Catechism 27

- **Q.** What do you understand by the providence of God?
- **A.** God's providence is his almighty and ever-present power, whereby, as with his hand, he still upholds heaven and earth and all creatures, and so governs them that leaf and blade, rain and drought, fruitful and barren years, food and drink, health and sickness, riches and poverty, indeed, all things, come to us not by chance but by his fatherly hand.
- (2) The providence of God is at work in the big things but also in the small things (vv. 15-29).
 - a) God's providence has the authority to accomplish mighty things, like rescuing David (vv. 15-22).
 - b) God's providence is also responsible for the simple things, like bread and milk (vv. 23-29).

APP: Through our text this morning, the Lord is shepherding us to believe and trust in his providence.

Heidelberg Catechism 28

- **Q.** What does it benefit us to know that God has created all things and still upholds them by his providence?
- **A.** We can be patient in adversity, thankful in prosperity, and with a view to the future we can have a firm confidence in our faithful God and Father that no creature shall separate us from his love; for all creatures are so completely in his hand that without his will they cannot so much as move.

2 Samuel 17 August 18, 2024 Pastor Mickey Klink

Read the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.

- 1) Can you describe an event or situation in your life that, in hindsight, you can see the providential hand of God at work?
- 2) Read v. 14 in our text for this week. How does that verse provide the key to understanding this text's point and give the primary application?
- 3) What aspects of the following definition of the providence of God stand out to you?

- 6) In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?
