

The Bondage of Bitterness or the Freedom of the Gospel

55th in the "Samuel" Series 2 Samuel 18:1-33 August 25, 2024 Pastor Brad Schreiner

Introduction: This text concludes Absalom's rebellion by showing the damaging effects of pride and bitterness	
1)	Unresolved anger leads to bitterness that negatively affects others. (vs. 1-18)
2)	Unresolved bitterness leads to sorrow, leaving you emotionally empty. (vs. 19-33)
	Ephesians 4:26-32 - Be angry and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, ²⁷ and give no opportunity to the devil. ²⁹ Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. ³¹ Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. ³² Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.

Response: Hebrews 12:14-15 - *Strive for peace with everyone and for holiness without which no one will see the* Lord. See to it that no one fails to obtain the grace of God; that no "root of bitterness" springs up and causes trouble, and by it, many become defiled.

Sunday Text Questions

2 Samuel 18:1-33 August 25, 2024 Pastor Brad Schreiner

Read the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.

1)	Returning to Chapter 13, we see Absalom's anger turning to bitterness over time to the point where he is now going to war with his father. Identify some consequences of this in Chapter 18.
2)	Think of a time when you had difficulty forgiving someone, or someone had difficulty forgiving you. What happened to the relationship? If the relationship is still bruised or broken, how can an attitude of forgiveness help you in this?
3)	Read Ephesians 4:26-32. How can this be applied to all our relationships? How well have you done?
4)	CS Lewis said, "Everyone says forgiveness is a lovely idea until they have something to forgive." Discuss the implications of this statement.
5)	Read vs. 18:33. What are things that David has lost? How can we take the example of the pride and bitterness of Absalom and the inaction and bitterness of David as an example to run to the cross in any relational conflicts we may have? Explain.

Further study this week: Passages related to the message of this week's text: Deuteronomy 21:23, Galatians 3:13, Matthew 6:9-15, Ephesians 4:26-32, Romans 5:8, Luke 17:3-4, Hebrews 12:14-15, 2 Corinthians 5:18-19


