

Introduction: All is not well in David's Kingdom. Conflict, power, and violence abound as sin taints God's chosen people.

Sunday Text Questions

2 Samuel 20:1-26 September 15, 2024 Pastor Casey Ehlers

Read the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.

1)	What is your posture towards difficult texts in Scripture? Do you tend to dig deep into them or skim them? Are you comfortable with unanswered questions?
2)	The consequences of sin linger and are multiple. What can David's life, and specifically this story, teach us about the necessity of confession and repentance?
3)	The 'sovereign' self lives by its own rules, sees people as a means to an end, and bends the rules without second thought. Reflect on Joab's actions from the text and how they serve as a cautionary tale.
4)	Who in our culture (athletes, politicians, celebrities, etc.) reminds you of Joab and his thirst for power?
5)	How in your heart do you tend to be like Joab? Are there convictions, values, ministries, or goals you pursue with a force of personality or politicking? What does humility look like in your life moving forward?
6)	In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?
