

He Gives his King

59th in the "Samuel" Series 2 Samuel 22 September 29, 2024 Pastor Mickey Klink

Introduction:

In this text, we see how intentional God is to explain to us the most important things in life.

Why does God give us such loaded descriptions in the Bible about who he is and what he has done?

- 1) So that we can learn what is true about God.
 - -v. 1: ...song when the Lord delivered him...
 - -v. 2: The Lord is my <u>rock</u>, my <u>fortress</u>, and my <u>deliverer</u>
 - -v. 4: I called to the Lord, who is worthy of praise
- 2) So that we can learn what is true about us.
 - -v. 20: "he rescued me because he delighted in me."
 - -vv. 22-23: "For I have kept the ways of the Lord" ... "All his laws are before me."
 - -v. 29: "You, Lord, are my lamp."
- 3) So that we can learn what is true about our world.
 - -v. 6: "The cords of the grave coiled around me; the snares of death confronted me."
 - -v. 18: "He rescued me from my powerful enemy, from my foes, who were too strong for me."
 - -v. 8: "The <u>earth</u> trembled and quaked, the <u>foundations</u> of the heavens shook."
- 4) So that we can place our hope in God, especially in his coming King (v. 51).
 - -1 Sam 2:10: He[God] will give strength to his king and exalt the horn of his anointed.
 - -v. 51: "He gives his king great victories; he shows unfailing kindness to his anointed, to David and his descendants forever."
 - -2 Sam 7:12-16: ¹² When your days are over and you rest with your ancestors, I will raise up your offspring to succeed you, your own flesh and blood, and I will establish his kingdom. ¹³ He is the one who will build a house for my Name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. ¹⁴ I will be his father, and he will be my son. ... ¹⁶ Your house and your kingdom will endure forever before me; your throne will be established forever."

and the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.	
1)	Do you find it easy or difficult to read the Bible, and why?
2)	Why do you think God would give us a 51-verse prayerful song by David loaded with lofty and detailed descriptions about God and his many ways of caring for us? In short, what is the point of such a text?
3)	How might the three interpretive questions (what does this text teach me about God, humanity, and/or the world?) offer helpful guidance for reading and applying this passage or any other passage of Scripture?
4)	What are the descriptions of God saying about him in v. 2, "The Lord is my rock, my fortress, and my deliverer," and how do we move beyond simply knowing those truths to truly living them?
5)	Why is it easier to study the Bible than to live the Bible, and what steps can we take to put the Bible into practice and not merely into knowledge?
6)	In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?

Further study this week: Passages related to the message of this week's text: 1 Samuel 2:2 (Mon); Deuteronomy 32:4 (Tues); Psalm 18:2, 31, 46 (Wed); Psalm 95;1 (Thurs) Matthew 16:18 (Fri).
