Understanding the Body of Christ

1 Corinthians 12:12-27

November 17, 2024

Introduction: In this text, God explains the important and purposeful connections between Christians in every local church.

- 1) Every Christian is divinely joined to the other Christians in their local church (vv. 12-13).

- 2) The church may be one body, but this body is also a collection of inter-related parts that require one another (vv. 14-17).

- 3) Every part of the body of Christ is important because every part is designed by God (vv. 18-21).

- 4) Not only is every part of the body significant, but God gives the most honor to the unheralded parts (vv. 22-26).

- 5) If you are a Christian, you are a significant and purposeful part of the body of Christ at Hope Church (v. 27).

Sunday Text Questions

1 Corinthians 12:12-27

November 17, 2024

Read the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.

- 1) What is the difference between a “pastor-elder” and a “deacon” in a local church?
- 2) How does Paul’s analogy of the human body help explain both the unity and the diversity of parts in every local church?
- 3) How does being “baptized by one Spirit” (v. 13) join every Christian to one another in a way that is more significant than all other human connections (“whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free”)?
- 4) Why is Paul so concerned to impress upon us the importance and necessity of every part of the body in the local church?
- 5) What “parts” of the local church get imbalanced priority or more focus in contemporary Christianity? Which parts are given more honor and attention? Which parts are seen as expendable or ignored altogether?
- 6) How have you seen the necessity of all the parts of the body of Christ at Hope Church, and what can we do to make sure that the necessity of all the parts of the body of Christ are known and appreciated?
- 7) In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?

Further study this week: Passages related to the message of this week’s text: Romans 12:4-5 (Mon); Ephesians 4:16 (Tues); Colossians 3:14-16 (Wed); Ephesians 3:6 (Thurs); 1 Corinthians 10:16-17 (Fri).
