The Offices of the Church

Ephesians 4:7-16 November 17, 2024 Pastor Mickey Klink

Introduction: In this text, we are given some of God's blueprint for the organization of the local church.

1) Christ the King gives ministry gifts to every member of the church (vv. 7-10).

2) Christ oversees the members of his church and nourishes their gifts through the establishment of leadership

- Extraordinary offices (whole church) vs. Ordinary offices (local church)
- 3) Jesus, the Chief Shepherd, has established two "offices" to lead and care for every local church: pastor-elder and deacon.
 - Philippians 1:1: Paul and Timothy, servants of Christ Jesus, To all God's holy people in Christ Jesus at Philippi, together with the overseers and deacons
 - <u>1 Timothy 3:1-2, 8</u>: Here is a trustworthy saying: Whoever aspires to be an overseer desires a noble task. Now the overseer is to be ... In the same way, deacons are to be...
 - <u>Titus 1:5</u>: The reason I left you in Crete was that you might put in order what was left unfinished and appoint elders in every town, as I directed you.
 - <u>1 Peter 5:1-2, 4</u>: To the elders among you, ... Be shepherds of God's flock that is under your care ... And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away.
 - Acts 20:17, 28: From Miletus, Paul sent to Ephesus for the elders of the church ... Keep watch over yourselves and all the flock of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers. Be shepherds of the church of God, which he bought with his own blood.
 - <u>Hebrews 13:17</u>: Have confidence in your leaders and submit to their authority, because they keep watch over you as those who must give an account. Do this so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no benefit to you.

Sunday Text Questions

Ephesians 4:7-16 November 24, 2024 Pastor Mickey Klink

Read the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.

1)	Why does the New Testament make such a big deal about the church? What is wrong with a Christianity that is just about you and Jesus?
2)	The apostle Paul says that "each one of us" has been given a gift for ministry in and to our church (v. 7). What gift(s) has the Lord given? How did (or can you) discover your gift(s) from the Lord?
3)	According to Paul, the officers of the church (pastor-elders and deacons) are assigned "to equip" the church for works of service" (v. 11). What should this equipping look like, and how well does Hope Church fulfill this assignment?
4)	How do (or should) pastor-elders do what vv. 13-15 explain: help Christians mature, avoid error, and form them to look like Jesus Christ?
5)	If God established the offices of pastor-elder and deacon and commanded them to be in every local church, how should you, as a member or attender of a church, respect or honor the offices' God-given purpose and authority?
6)	Are you faithfully using your gift(s) to serve and minister to your church? Why or why not? And if not, what is hindering you?
7)	In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?
