
Deacons at Hope Church

4thin the "Deacon" Series Romans 12:1-8 December 15, 2024 Pastor Mickey Klink

Introduction: In this text we are exhorted to think soberly of ourselves and serve others as a response to God's grace to us.

Review: **Deacons** are the ministry leads and staff who oversee the core ministries of the church. They are commissioned by the **pastor-elders and serve as** servant leaders over the many **volunteers** who serve in their areas of ministry.

| 3) | The apostle Paul says that "each member [Christian] belongs to all the others" (v. 5). What does that mean, and how should that direct how we relate to one another? |
| 4) | What does Paul mean when he says, "We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us (v. 6)? How does that make every person and their gift significant? How does that help us avoid competition or comparison? |
| 5) | How has this series on the office of deacon helped you understand the ministry of deacons or God's design for the church? |
| 6) | Do you think you would be a good deacon, why or why not? |
| 7) | In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)? |
