

He Has Chosen You

2nd in the "Thessalonians" Series 1 Thessalonians 1:4-10 January 19, 2025 Pastor Mickey Klink

Introduction: In this text, we are taught about the doctrine of election and how God is involved in our salvation.

1)	Christians are both "chosen" by God and those who "welcome the message" (v. 4).
2)	Those chosen by God will display in word and deed the work of God in their life (vv. 5-10).
	• They hear the gospel message and receive it (vv. 5, 6).
	• They show a work of the Holy Spirit that leads to deep conviction (v. 5).
	• They begin to act like disciples of Jesus (vv. 6-10).
Pas	storal Application: Altar Calls.

Sunday Text Questions

1 Thessalonians 1:4-10 January 19, 2025 Pastor Mickey Klink

Read the text aloud and discuss any significant observations or issues needing clarification together.

1)	Have you ever seen an "altar call" at church or gone forward during one? What have your experiences been like, or what are your thoughts regarding altar calls?
2)	Paul explains that God not only "loved" us but that "he has chosen you" (v. 4). What does it mean that God "has chosen" you, and what is your reaction to that statement?
3)	How is it possible that God chose us $(v. 4)$, and yet we also and actively choose God ("you welcomed the message" – $v. 6$)? How can we properly balance both those biblical truths?
4)	Paul lists several visible evidences of a person who is truly converted or saved, like "deep conviction" (v. 5) and acting like true disciples (vv. 6-10). How are these Christian "fruits" an important sign of true faith and essential if a person is really a Christian?
5)	Here is a difficult topic: Can a person be a Christian and yet bear no real Christian fruit?
6)	If you are a Christian, how has the fruit of the gospel which you believed, however long ago, grown and blossomed in your life?
7)	In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?

Further study this week: Passages related to the message of this week's text: John 15:16 (Mon); Ephesians 1:4-5 (Tues); Romans 8:28-30 (Wed); 2 Timothy 1:9 (Thurs); John 6:44 (Fri).
