

The Day of the Lord

14th in the "Thessalonians" Series 1 Thessalonians 5:1-5 June 1, 2025 Pastor Mickey Klink

Introduction: In this text we are encouraged and warned about how God will conclude history with the Day of the Lord.

- 1) If the coming of the Lord is wonderful for God's people, it is horrible for the rest of humanity, for those who have rejected God (vv. 1-5).
- 2) What Paul wants us to ground our hope and patience in is the important biblical concept of "The Day of the Lord" (v. 2).

<u>Definition</u>: "The Day of the Lord" becomes a technical term in Scripture for the final act of God in history, which is centered on Christ, and where God both provides the final act of redemption for his people and the formal act of judgment for the world. People who have denied or rejected God should fear this Day, whereas believers should anticipate it with hope.

(1) The Day of the Lord is bad news for unbelievers and good news for believers.

Malachi 4:1-5: ¹ "Surely the day is coming; it will burn like a furnace. All the arrogant and every evildoer will be stubble, and the day that is coming will set them on fire," says the Lord Almighty. "Not a root or a branch will be left to them. ² But for you who revere my name, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its rays. And you will go out and frolic like well-fed calves. ³ Then you will trample on the wicked; they will be ashes under the soles of your feet on the day when I act," says the Lord Almighty. ⁴ "Remember the law of my servant Moses, the decrees and laws I gave him at Horeb for all Israel. ⁵ "See, I will send the prophet Elijah to you before that great and dreadful day of the Lord comes.

- (2) The Day of the Lord began with Jesus' first coming and ends with Jesus' second coming.
- (3) The Day of the Lord is when God rights every wrong: God is vindicated, evil doers and suffering is defeated, the problem of evil is solved, and all creation is redeemed.
- (4) The Day of the Lord is not to be feared by the Christian but is to be formative on how we live and a source of hope.

Pastoral reflection: What does God want us to understand about "the end times" from this text?

- (1) It is misguided and even unbiblical to obsess over "end times" predictions and fascinations.
- (2) The warning of this text is that the world is living in the first creation without knowing, preparing, or hoping for the new creation.

Response

Hope Church, you are all children of the light and children of the day! Let us live with intention and hope.

Sunday Text Questions

1 Thessalonians 5:1-5 June 1, 2025 Pastor Mickey Klink

Read the text aloud and discuss any significant observations or issues needing clarification.

1)	Do the Bible's end-time prophecies and promises comfort you or scare you, and why?
2)	Paul (like Jesus) is against Christians thinking about and looking into times and dates for Christ's return (v. 1). Why is that something Christians should not do?
3)	Read the definition of "the Day of the Lord" below. How does that definition help explain Paul's message to us in our text this week? Definition: "The Day of the Lord" becomes a technical term in Scripture for the final act of God in history, which is centered on Christ, and where God both provides the final act of redemption for his people and the formal act of judgment for the world. People who have denied or rejected God should fear this day, whereas believers should anticipate it with hope.
4)	How can the Day of the Lord be a time when God both judges and defeats evil and the wicked and yet also redeem and bless all creation and his people?
5)	Paul clearly states that the world is living as if there is no judgment, even no God. Do Christians live all that differently? What would it look like if Christians truly lived and hoped for the redeemed world to come?
6)	How does this text help you better understand the "end times" and the way God will be faithful to us and his creation as he has promised?
7)	In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16).
