

1)	It is the Lord's will for you to take pleasure in his many good gifts to us (v. 16).
2)	It is the Lord's will for you to live with a constant awareness of his presence (v. 17).
	Romans 8: <sup>5</sup> Those who live according to the flesh have their minds set on what the flesh desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires. <sup>6</sup> The mind governed by the flesh is death, but the mind governed by the Spirit is life and peace. <sup>7</sup> The mind governed by the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law, nor can it do so. <sup>8</sup> Those who are in the realm of the flesh cannot please God. <sup>9</sup> You, however, are not in the realm of the flesh but are in the realm of the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God lives in you.
3)	It is the Lord's will for you to acknowledge him as the giver of all good things (v. 18).

# **Sunday Text Questions**

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 June 29, 2025 Pastor Mickey Klink

Read the text aloud and discuss any significant observations or issues needing clarification.

1)	How would you describe God's will for your life, and how do you know what it is?
2)	How much more seriously should we take God's instructions for us when he specifically says it is "God's will for you" (v. 18)?
3)	If "rejoice always" (v. 16) means to take pleasure in God's many gifts to us, what does that look like in practice? How are God's gifts both universal (common grace) and particular for Christians (special grace)?
4)	If "pray continually" (v. 17) means to live with a constant awareness of God's presence, what does that look like in practice? How can such prayerfulness be both an awareness of and a submission to the ways of God?
5)	If "give thanks in all circumstances" (v. 18) means to acknowledge God as the giver of all good things, what does that look like in practice?
6)	How can Christians have joy and be thankful when they hurt, especially when the suffering does not seem to have anything for which to be thankful?
7)	In what other ways, if any, did this passage speak into your life to teach, rebuke, correct, or train you in righteousness (cf. 2 Timothy 3:16)?
