

## Jesus the True Temple

3<sup>rd</sup> in the Advent Series December 14, 2025 Pastor Casey Ehlers

**Introduction:** In this Advent message, we trace the beautiful trajectory of the temple and "God with Us" in the birth, life, and death of Jesus Christ – the 'tabernacling' one.

<u>Advent Series Theme</u>: God's plan to be "God with us" is the story that all of Scripture tells, from Genesis to Revelation. God desires to dwell with His people, and that is the goal of Creation, Israel, **the Incarnation**, and the New Creation.

- 1) All of the Old Testament, from Creation to the people of God, the sacrificial system, and the temple, points to Jesus.
  - a) Glimpses of 'God with Us' in the life, ministry, and death of Jesus:
    - John 1:1-5; 14
    - John 1:43-51
    - John 2:13-22
    - John 20:11-18
- 2) The message of "God with us" in the New Testament teaches the church today three things about God's intentions to dwell with us.
  - a) God goes to great lengths to be with his people!
  - b) The church, cumulatively together, makes up the New Covenant's temple, with Christ as the head. (Ephesians 1:22-23, 2:19-22)
  - c) The church is the New Covenant blessing to the world, pointing with Gospel hope towards the future consummation of all things.

## Response

Advent trains us to sit in the beauty of and longing for "God with us."
